

The AIM has expressed "severe disappointment" with the Varanasi district judge's decision to allow puja in the basement of the Gyanvapi mosque.

On January 31, the Varanasi district judge's court granted permission for the worship of deities inside the southern cellar of the Gyanvapi mosque by priests appointed by the Shri Kashi Vishwanath Temple Trust.

Following the court's verdict, the district administration ensured prompt compliance with the order on the same day. In a letter addressed to the Muslim community, AIM secretary and Mufti-e-Banaras, Maulana Abdul Batin Nomani, said, "We assure you that we will continue our efforts until our last breath for the safety and conservation of the Gyanvapi mosque."

Criticising the district judge's decision, the AIM secretary said, "On the basis of the permission given by the district judge for worship in the southern basement of Gyanvapi, the district administration not only placed idols in it overnight but also involved the deployed CRPF, in whose functioning everyone had faith, in this conspiracy." He added, "This onesided action has hurt the sentiments of all of us, and we condemn this decision."



36 prisoners test HIV positive in Lucknow jail

Lucknow, Feb 6 (IANS): Thirty-six prisoners lodged in Lucknow District Jail have tested positive for HIV infection, pushing the total caseload of viral infection in the prison to 47. All HIV-infected patients are receiving treatment at a hospital in Lucknow. Before the fresh 36 cases, 11 prisoners had earlier tested positive for HIV.

The diagnosis came as part of health tests conducted by the Uttar Pradesh Health Department in December 2023.

As part of the prisoners' treatment, the jail administration has started counselling for the infected prisoners. The authorities have been vigilant after these cases were reported and allowed dietary changes for the infected people. A jail official said that the diet of infected prisoners had been

Also, all the prisoners found positive have been kept under the observation of doctors.

They are receiving treatment at KGMU's Anti-Retroviral Therapy (ART) Centre.

The health screening of prisoners was carried out on the orders of the state AIDS Control Society, said Ashish Tiwari, Jail Superintendent, Lucknow.

Someshwara temple Shivling desecrated in K'taka

Uttara Kannada (Karnataka), Feb 6 (IANS): An incident of miscreants desecrating the 'Shivling' in the famous Someshwara Temple in Narabail village in Uttara Kannada district of Karnataka was reported on Tuesday. Some scribbling was found on the Shivling. According to the police, the incident came to light after the priest opened the door of the sanctum sanctorum on Tuesday. The miscreants had forcibly pushed the door, broken the smaller lock and gained entry. The scribbling was found all over the

Shivalinga and had been made with chalk. The miscreants left markings that read "JES 2024, 2026" on the Shivalinga, leading to many suspicions. The Sirsi Rural police rushed to the spot and initiated an investigation. A tense situation is prevailing in the region following the incident. Police said that the scribbling was suspicious, and experts were aiding in the investigation.

The temple authorities informed the police that there was no confusion or internal strife related to the temple management.

AI-GENERATED CONTENT HOLDS PROMISES AS WELL AS PERILS

rtificial intelligence has made tremendous strides in recent years—from beating human champions at chess to revolutionizing selfdriving cars and setting up life-like virtual assistants. Now, AI is putting its creative hat on and venturing into the world of content generation. While AI shows great promise for automating routine, and mundane, writing tasks and producing large volumes of content, its use also raises important questions about originality, quality and its impact on jobs. The question whether—or even when—AI will eventually replace human intervention in writing is being hotly debated even as we write this piece. Let us take a closer look at how AI is shaping the future of content and the challenges it present. On the positive side, AI content holds potential benefits for productivity and economies of scale. With the help of AI, businesses can generate basic articles, blog posts, social media updates and other forms of written work much more quickly than humans can. This allows companies to inundate their websites and online channels with a constant stream of fresh content to engage customers. In recent times, AI algorithms that are capable of producing not only articles, but even poetry and novels have emerged. These AI-generated pieces often demonstrate impressive linguistic capabilities and can closely resemble varied scholastic writing styles. This development has been greeted with both excitement and concern by authors and creative writing buffs. However, leading publishing companies like Amazon, as well as admission officers of leading universities, have strong reservations—and rules—against using AI for books written by aspiring authors and SOPs written by aspiring students. From a commercial point of view, there are open questions around how to integrate AI creativity while respecting copyright and paying creators for their work. Some debate whether AI should even be termed an 'author' or assigned legal rights over its writing. These issues take on greater importance as AI systems become more general and human-like in their abilities. While the final output can still be riddled with errors, biases, or simply plain bad or basic writing, and even though the programme, at present, has not been creating as much as collating data and replicating common patterns, a future may not be too far off when artificial intelligence processes even more data, 'learns' from it and gets more adept at writing at frightening speed. In spite of these apparent advantages, the idea that AI will one day completely make human intervention in creative writing defunct remains a matter of debate. Creative writing is an immersive human endeavour involving intuition, emotions and subjective thought processes based on analysing deeply personal experiences. It involves crafting content that resonates with readers at an emotional level, building empathy and connection

These attributes are intrinsically tied to the human condition, making it challenging for AI to replicate human experience and feelings with the same authenticity and depth. Creative writing is not merely an exercise in stringing words together, but involves exploration and simulation of ideas, expression of unique angles of thought and, mostly, ability to capture the spirit of human existence. It requires wide imagination, intuition and a profound understanding of the intricacies of language.

between creator and consumer.

Although AI algorithms have the capacity to mimic different styles of writing, they often lack the creativity that thrives on capriciousness and extrapolation of imageries and sensitivities of original writing that stems from the human mind's capacity to think outside the box, challenge conventions and generate fresh ideas. AI algorithms, instead, rely on patterns collated from existing data. It can generate content that conforms only to existing and established structures, but is yet to produce path-breaking work.

Another plus point for AI, for the first time, is that it makes it feasible for companies to automatically localize content for different regions and languages. Language has always proved to be a significant barrier in consumption of media content. However, AIbased translation apps have significantly broken down these barriers. State-of-the-art machine algorithms can provide real-time translations of text, audio and video content, allowing media organizations to cater to a global audience, facilitating cross-cultural communication and enabling a wider range of viewers to access content. A recent article in Nieman Reports says that, in the months immediately following the Russian invasion of Ukraine in 2022, tens of thousands of Ukrainians displaced by the war who fled to Finland had a great deal of difficulty understanding local public broadcasts in Finnish.

IRAN FACILITATES BIDEN'S SUPPORT FOR ISRAEL, BUT TEL AVIV MAKES IT INCREASINGLY DIFFICULT

The irony of Middle Eastern geopolitics is that Israel makes it increasingly difficult for US President Joe Biden to support it, while Iran strengthens domestic US anti-Iranian and pro-Israeli hardliners. The hardliners are emboldened by the failure of calibrated US strikes in response to numerous attacks on US forces in the Middle East and on shipping in the Red Sea to deter Iranian-backed militia groups in Iraq, Syria, and Yemen. The deaths this week of three American soldiers in an attack on a US military base on the Jordanian-Syrian border by an Iranian-backed Iraqi militia alliance potentially mark a watershed that could send regional tensions spinning out of control. American anti-Iranian hardliners and pro-Israeli forces pressure Mr. Biden to strike back hard, possibly by targeting Iran directly.

Iran may not direct or plan the attacks but likely can persuade its non-state allies, who justify their attacks with the Israeli assault on Gaza, to step back. Iran and its non-state partners have publicly affirmed that various militias benefit from Iranian funding, weapon supplies, and training. Iran would like to keep the Middle East at a boiling point without tensions expanding Gaza into a regional war. Iran benefits from Gaza fuelling popular anti-Americanism in the Middle East.

MYANMAR JUNTA LOSING MORE AREAS TO REBELS AS THE COUP COMPLETES THREE YEARS

n the third anniversary of the military coup military to engage in meaningin Myanmar, a joint statement from the European Union, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Norway, South Korea, Switzerland, the United Kingdom, and the United States condemned the ongoing violence and human rights abuses perpetrated by the military regime. The statement released by Global Affairs Canada highlighted the devastating impact of the coup. Thousands of civilians have been jailed, tortured, and killed. Its military rule has caused the widespread destruction of infrastructure and the displacement of millions of people, it said.

"Under the military regime, violence against civilians has escalated, with thousands jailed, tortured and killed. Airstrikes, shelling and arson have been used to destroy civilian infrastructure, including homes, schools, healthcare facilities and places of worship.... The military's actions have fuelled a growing humanitarian crisis with 2.6 million people displaced from their homes and more than 18 million people in need," the statement from Global Affairs Canada stated. The statement urged the

ful dialogue with all stakeholders and implement the Five-Point Consensus adopted by the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN). It also called on the UN Security Council to strengthen its efforts and urged all member states to support humanitarian needs in Myanmar and neighbouring countries.

Three years ago, on February 1, 2021, Myanmar's military overthrew the democratically elected government, detaining Aung San SuuKyi and other leaders. The coup plunged the country into an ongoing conflict with significant humanitarian consequences.

PTI's future 'prospects' in Pakistan politics

Islamabad, Feb 6 (IANS): Future of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI), which emerged as a major political party in the country in the 2013 general polls, is in the doldrums as nomination papers of several party leaders, including founder Imran Khan, have been rejected by the Election Commission of Pakistan over corruption charges.

Though Khan, former prime minister, is languishing in jail on charges of corruption and misplacement of secret document for 14 years and 10 years respectively, he enjoys love and support of

The PTI also lost its electoral symbol 'bat' leaving the party's nominated candidates with no other option but to contest as independent candidates.

With PTI and its leader Imran Khan out of the picture, many believe that the tone for the polls has already been set as the country heads towards another process of "selection" rather than "election". It is believed that the May 9, 2023 riots, triggered after the arrest of Khan in Islamabad, which saw angry party supporters storming



military installations across the country, became the prime reason for the downfall of PTI and its leadership.

"The military establishment under COAS (Chief of Army Staff) General Syed Asim Munir seems to have decided to dismantle and destroy PTI as part of their punishment for attacking military installations on 9th May," said senior political analyst Javed Siddique. "We see an open, blatant and targeted dismantling of PTI, its workers, its leaders and its founder as anyone and everyone who tries to even come out of their home with a PTI flag are taken into custody. The party is not allowed to hold even a corner meeting for political campaigning. Its candidates are now contesting polls under multiple election symbols in independent capacity.

It is almost clear to all now that PTI has been kept out of these elections deliberately," he added. A different version of analysis on PTI still remains that while it may not be contesting the upcoming elections, the party itself may be a major asset for the military establishment after the formation of the new elected government.


UP ATS arrests man for sharing info with ISI



Far from speeding up delivery of justice, Odisha's village courts battle backlogs

Odisha was among the states that were the first to introduce Gram Nyayalayas, or village courts, after the Act paving the way for them came into effect on October 2, 2009.

A little less than 15 years later, far from ensuring speedy justice to those who need it the most, the state's Gram Nyayalayas are mired in a pile of pending cases because of the apathy of the key stakeholders, including the police, lawyers and the state government.

The Law Commission, in its 114th report in 1986, had proposed that Gram Nyayalayas be set up across

Bhubaneswar, Feb 6 (IANS): the country to ensure access to justice for the weaker sections of the society and reduce delays in the delivery of justice. The Gram Nyayalayas Bill was passed by Parliament on December 22, 2008, and the Act came into effect on October 2, 2009. Though the Act does not make it mandatory for states to set up Gram Nyayalayas, yet Odisha was among a few states to roll out the concept in 2009, hoping to deliver justic to citizens literally at their doorsteps. Odisha has 20 operational Gram Nyayalayas out of the 24 that have so far been notified by the state government.

As per the information available with the Department of Justice under Union Ministry of Law and Justice, Odisha received Rs 524.4 lakh from the central government for the establishment of the village courts. Bur the village courts are yet to fully achieve the objectives they were set up for. The Gram Nyayalayas, which were expected to reduce the pendency of cases in subordinate courts.

Kolkata, Feb 6 (IANS): Enforcement Directorate (ED) probing the ration distribution case in West Bengal has been able to track a fictitious transaction made in dollars through a Dubai-based license-expired corporate entity linked to the arrested Trinamool Congress leader, Shankar Adhya.

Sources said this transaction was made in October 2019 just a few months before the license of the said corporate entity expired.

ED sleuths, sources added, have strong hunch that the corporate entity was floated only for the specific purpose of diverting the proceeds of the ration distribution case in West Bengal.

Adhya was arrested on the late night of January 5 from his residence at Bangaon in North

24 Parganas district after the ED sleuths conducted a marathon raid and search operation there. Initially, sources said, during the interrogation the arrested ruling party leaders claimed before the central agency sleuths that Adhya floated the Dubai- based company with the purpose of entering into export business. However, sources said, the ED sleuths on cross-checking found the only business where the company's name surfaced was in relation to some fictitious transactions made in foreign currencies through the Dubai- based bank account. That is where the ED sleuths became quite sure that the said corporate entity was basically a shell company floated for a limited period with the purpose of diverting the scam proceeds externally.

Since the beginning of investigations in various cases of money laundering in West Bengal, the ED sleuths have noted the prevalence of the use of shell companies for the purpose of fund diversion. The directors of such entities are mainly the close relatives or associates of scam masterminds, some of whom are already behind the bars.



Haryana bans plastic bottles for country-made liquor

Chandigarh, Feb 6 (IANS): Haryana Deputy Chief Minister Dushvant Chautala on Tuesday announced that from March 1, country-made liquor would not be sold in plastic bottles.

This move makes Haryana the first state in the country to impose a ban on the use of plastic.

Chautala, who also holds the portfolio of Excise and Taxation, told the media here that with a 30 per cent increase in GST collection over the past four years, the government achieved 16 per cent growth this fiscal with the collection of Rs 32,456 crore as tax. Despite initially setting a target of Rs 36,000 crore for GST collection, Chautala expressed confidence in meeting the target in time.

Kolkata, Feb 6 (IANS): from several parts of the country. The British East India Come Tuesday and the Indian Company started recruiting Lascars in the 1600s for ships returning to England.

There was a reason behind this. Most ships would be shortstaffed on the start of their voyage back home.

Many seafarers simply deserted after the ships docked in India. Several others were killed due to disease during the long voyage.

The Lascars were cheap labour and readily acceded to perform the most menial of jobs on board.

The demand for Lascars grew after the opening of the Suez Canal and increase in the number of ships calling on India. The advent of steamships also required crew who could handle jobs such as stoking coal.

It is estimated that by the 1850s, there were 12,000 Lascars working on English merchant vessels. This was a substantial number. Once the ships docked in England, trouble would start for the Lascars. They would run out of their meagre earnings soon and end up on the streets, cold and



hungry. It would be a long wait before they got jobs on ships starting for India. This situation prevailed even after the start of World War I. During the War, several merchantmen were targeted and sunk.

7 Manipur Police trainees of different ethnic groups injured in clash at Assam Police Academy

Guwahati/Imphal, Feb 6 Trainees of other northeastern (IANS): At least seven Manipur Police trainees, undergoing training at Lachit Borphukan Police Academy in Assam's Golaghat district, were injured when a clash broke out between cadets of two ethnic groups, police said on Tuesday.



Himachal to have automated milk processing plant

Shimla, Feb 6 (IANS): Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu on Tuesday said the government has signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) to provide consultancy services for the establishment of a state-ofthe-art automated milk processing plant in Kangra district. He said the plant, with an initial capacity of 1.50 lakh litres per day (LLDP) and expandable up to three LLPD would be a fully automatic facility.

This ambitious project, set to be constructed with an investment of Rs 225 crore in the first phase in Dhagwar, aims to produce a diverse range of dairy products, including curd, lassi, butter, ghee, paneer, flavoured milk, khoya and mozzarella cheese.

Sukhu said as the project would contribute significantly to the overall growth of the state.

Congress sends 16 of its Bihar MLAs to Hyderabad to avoid any poaching bid

Patna, Feb 6 (IANS): In a bid to forestall any poaching, the Congress on Tuesday sent 16 out of its 19 MLAs in Bihar to Hyderabad. The Congress has 19 MLAs in Bihar and three -Sidhartha, Abidur Rahman and Vijay Shankar Dubey - have not gone due to health reasons.

Doghouse to PM House? Master of comebacks Nawaz Sharif takes centre stage

Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) supremo Nawaz Sharif, who has made a comeback into country's politics after five years of selfimposed exile; is being tipped as the next Prime Minister of the country with army in his corner and his opponent PTI founder Imran Khan in jail. Sharif, who was ousted from power three times, his daughter Maryam Nawaz Sharif and brother Shehbaz Sharif continue to stage impressive political power shows in the country's largest province

> It is widely believed that Nawaz has the stage set for him to win the elections and form the next government. This assured optimism prevails as his return is being linked to an alleged deal he has done with the military establishment to come back into power. Even if Nawaz fails to become the prime minister or form the government; whoever assumes the premiership will need his blessings and support.

> It is now an open secret in Pakistan that the tides have been turned in favor for Nawaz.

Since Nawaz's return, the PML-N has been accelerating the momentum of its election campaign, staging big gatherings in parts of Punjab and the Khyber Pukhtunkhwa (KP) provinces, claiming that his credentials are the most suited to get the country out of its wreckage of inflation and put it on course to development and growth.

Another reason for Nawaz's easy way to success is that Khan is in jail on charges of corruption, among others, and PTI has been stripped off its election symbol

Nawaz's confidants said that the strategy to engage with the masses is focused on two main points -connecting with the voters and patronisation on relevant issues of rural constituencies.

"During his speeches, Nawaz asks: 'How much one roti (bread) cost when I left in 2017? How much did a kilo of sugar cost during his tenure? How much did one electricity unit cost? How much did a bag of urea fertiliser cost?' All these questions are focused on using the old patronage machines that run the rural and per-urban constituencies", said political analyst Javed Siddique.

"Nawaz smartly varies in the list of questions he asks to his voters

during his speeches. The variation is based on the constituency's urban or rural character. So he is playing it smart and reminding the people of his time in comparison with today's situation, Siddique added.

Nawaz's messaging is crafted smartly and carefully as since his ouster in 2017, Pakistan has witnessed unprecedented surge in inflation and unemployment. What''s important is Sharif doesn't emphasize on why it happened and has to only point out that it happened.

Keeping 2017 as his starting point, Nawaz smartly glides over the 16 month government performances of his brother and former premier Shehbaz Sharif, and promises all of CPEC (China Pakistan Economic Corridor) projects, motorways, medical colleges, among others. While the tides have certainly and forcefully turned in favor of Nawaz, the big question is if he would be able to deliver on his promises in the country which is facing challenges like inflation, energy prices and weakened foreign demand.

Iran unveils homegrown anti-armour missile system

Tehran, Feb 6 (IANS): The Iranian Army's Aviation has unveiled an upgraded version of a domestically developed air-to-surface anti-armour missile system, according to a media report. Dubbed Shafaq (Dawn), the smart precision-guided missile system was unveiled in a ceremony attended by Chief Commander of the Iranian Army Abdolrahim Mousavi, Commander of the Iranian Army's Ground Force Kioumars Heydari and other high-ranking military officials during an exhibition in Tehran on Tuesd, the semi-official

Fars news agency reported. Designed and developed by Iranian experts, the Shafaq missile system is capable of hitting targets with pinpoint accuracy within a range of 20 km and can be used for different tactical and operational strategies, Xinhua news agency

reported, citing Fars. The missile system, which can be installed on different helicopters of the Iranian Army's Aviation, is equipped with fire-and-forget guidance technology, an upgraded warhead and an infrared search and track system, which enable it to hit

targets in different climate conditions and during night hours, the report said. Among the other Iranian weapons and military equipment showcased in the exhibition were the homegrown Yousef night vision system, combat simulation systems, air-borne self-protection systems, various air-launched longrange cruise missiles, air-to-surface anti-tank guided missiles, Qadr-29 missile system, different kinds of reconnaissance and suicide unmanned aerial vehicles, flight simulation systems and super-heavy tank transporters, according to Fars.



Russia condemns US strikes on Syria, Iraq

Moscow, Feb 6 (IANS): Russia strongly condemns the US strikes on Syria and Iraq and is seeking an immediate review of the emerging situation through the United Nations (UN) Security Council, Russian Foreign Ministry spokesperson Maria Zakharova has said. "American airstrikes involving strategic bombers across Iraq and Syria, ... once again demonstrated to the world the aggressive nature of US policy in the Middle East and Washington's complete disregard for international law," Zakharova said on Saturday in a Telegram post.

The spokesperson said the US is purposefully trying to plunge the largest countries in the region into conflict by conducting the strikes, Xinhua news agency reported. "Recent events confirm that the United States is not and has never been looking for



solutions to problems in the region," she added. The US on Friday carried out strikes on Iran-linked militia targets in Syria and Iraq in retaliation for a deadly attack on its military base in Jordan.



Ballot 2024: What do

Indian-American voters want

New Delhi, Feb 6 (IANS): A robust economy, safety and security of citizens, fixing the southern border crisis, and thriving relations with India are some of the demands put forth by the nearly four-million-strong Indian-American community as the US rolls up its sleeves for Ballot 2024. Surprising many political voters, the community emerged as the most coveted bloc in the 2020 election with a record 71 per cent rate of voting among Asian Americans and ensuring President Joe Biden's victory.

At least 10 Indian-Americans, mostly Democrats, won local and state-level elections held in several parts of the country last year, reflecting the growing political prowess of the ethnic community. For the first time in the history of the country, two Indian-American candidates -- Nikki Haley and Vivek Ramaswamy -- locked horns on the Republican presidential debate stage, giving a tough fight to former president and GOP frontrunner Donald Trump.

Key US Senator clears decks for MQ-9B drones for India

Washington, Feb 6 (IANS) : A senior US lawmaker, whose approval paved the way for the Joe Biden administration formally notifying US Congress of the proposed sale of MQ-9B Sea Guardian drone, has said he has in return extracted a commitment from the administration that India will fully cooperate in the investigation of the murder-for-hire case in which an Indian official is alleged to have tried to kill a Khalistani activist.

The decks are clear now for the smooth passage for the deal through Congress, which has 30 days to either do nothing and let the administration take it to the next stage, or kill it though a "hold" by leaders of the foreign and armed services committees of the Senate and the House of Representatives; the former is controlled now by the Democrats and the latter by the Republicans.

The administration notified the US Congress on Thursday that it proposes to sell 31 MQ-9B drones made by General Atomics to India for nearly \$4 billion. The deal was announced way back in June last year by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Joe Biden.





1st BIMSTEC C'ships: India's initiative to develop 'sporting culture' in Bay of Bengal region

New Delhi, Feb 6 (IANS): India is hosting the BIMSTEC Aquatics Championships in the national capital which will see athletes from the Bay of Bengal region competing under several disciplines at the Dr Syama Prasad Mukherjee Swimming Pool complex starting Tuesday. The sporting competition involving South Asian and Southeast Asian nations is said to be the 'brainchild' of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, and over the next four days, it will see sportspersons from seven countries compete for top honours. BIMSTEC (Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation) comprises five members from South Asia (Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Nepal and Sri Lanka) and two members from Southeast Asia (Myanmar and Thailand). The grouping was

formed in 1997 to foster closer economic and social relations among member nations. Kicking off the championship on Tuesday, Union Sports Minister Anurag Thakur said that this will sow the seeds for sporting culture in a region that is home to about 1/4th of the world's population. "World's 25 per cent population lives in South Asia and Southeast Asian region," Thakur said while launching the water sports tournament. Notably,

Modi had announced the BIMSTEC Youth water sports competition at the 2018 Summit. The event was initially proposed for 2021, but its launch got deferred due to the Covid-19 outbreak.

The BIMSTEC Aquatics Championships is seen as a groundbreaking initiative and experts are hopeful of this region emerging as a 'breeding ground' for new sporting talent.



Case registered against Tokyo bronze medalist Varun Kumar under POCSO Act : Report

New Delhi, Feb 6 (IANS): Tokyo Olympics bronze medallist hockey player Varun Kumar was booked under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act by Karnataka Police on Tuesday, according to a report. According to NNIS Sports, a 22-year-old woman has filed a formal complaint accusing Varun of raping her under the pretence of marriage. The woman asserts that she met Varun on Instagram when she was 17 years old, and the two of them used to get together frequently. The lady has accused Varun of having sex with her while he was in Bengaluru to attend the Indian men's hockey

team's national training camp at the Sports Authority of India Centre. The case was registered a few days before India's opening match against Spain in the FIH Pro League season 2023-24 at Kalinga Stadium in Bhubaneswar. Although Varun was included in the tournament's 24-person roster, the most recent event now calls into question his selection.

Varun was a member of the historic team that won the bronze medal in the Tokyo Olympics and has been a consistent member of the Indian men's hockey team for the past few years. In addition, he competed for the team that won the gold medal in the Asian Games in Hangzhou, China, in 2023.



Zaheer Khan wants improvement in Indian batting lineup, says: 'There is a lot of work to be done'

New Delhi, Feb 6 (IANS): Following India's impressive 106-run victory over England in the second Test in Visakhapatnam, former India cricketer Zaheer Khan has raised a pertinent point about the team's batting unit, despite the triumph. While acknowledging the stellar performances by Yashasvi Jaiswal and Shubman Gill, Zaheer Khan emphasised that there remains significant room for improvement within the batting lineup. The Vizag Test witnessed standout performances from Jaiswal, who etched his name in the record books with a memorable 209 in the first innings, and Gill, who displayed resilience with a gritty knock of 104 in the second innings. These exceptional innings laid the foundation for India's commanding position in the match, setting up a daunting target of 399 runs for England to chase. However, beyond the heroics of Jaiswal and Gill, Zaheer Khan expressed concern over the inconsistent performance of other batters. Despite promising starts, players like Shreyas Iyer and Rajat Patidar failed to capitalise on their opportunities, highlighting a glaring issue that needs to be addressed within the team.

AIFF's 2024-25 domestic season to start with Durand Cup on July 26

New Delhi, Feb 6 (IANS): The All-India Foot- league season from October to ball Federation (AIFF) on Tuesday announced the domestic competition calendar for the 2024-25 season, with the senior men's calendar set to kick off with the Durand Cup on July 26.

The Indian Super League (ISL) will begin on September 14 and will end on April 30, 2025, the I-League in mid-October, the Indian Women's League in late October, IWL 2 in late January and I-League 2 in mid-January. All these senior leagues are set to finish by the end of April 2025. I-League 3, which will act as a qualifying tournament for I-League 2, will be held in August and September.

The Super Cup will run concurrently with the

mid-May. The AIFF Youth Leagues (U13/U15/U17) are set to have a nine-month calendar from September to May.

As far as the national state tournaments are concerned, the season will begin with the Junior Boys and Junior Girls National Football Championship Tier 1 and Tier 2 in July, followed by the Sub-Junior Boys and Sub-Junior Girls National Football Championship Tier 1 and Tier 2 in August.
