New Delhi, Jan 27 (IANS): ticipants in the Republic Day parade and said that it is not a result of overnight success but the dedicated efforts of the last 10 years. "Nari has always been considered as Shakti in Indian traditions," Modi remarked as he mentioned valiant warriors like Rani Lakshmi Bai, Rani Chennamma and Queen Velu Nachiyar who crushed the British. He said that removing all obstacles in the entry of women into sectors which were once barred or limited and gave examples of opening up the front line of all three defence forces, permanent commission for women in defence, and command roles and combat positions. "Be it Agniveer or fighter pilots the participation of women is only increasing," Modi said. He also informed about the opening of admission for girl students in Sainik Schools. "Number of women in the Central Armed Forces has more than doubled in the last 10 years, while states are being encouraged to recruit more women in the state police force," Modi said. He also talked about the change in mentality of calling the border village as the last village. "Now these villages are the 'first villages' the 'Vibrant Villages'. These villages are going to become big tourist centers in the coming days," Modi said. Meanwhile, the Ministry of Defence said that Subedar Preeti Rajak, Trap Shooter, has created history as she has become the First woman Subedar of the Indian Army.



CM directs officials to prepare estimation on promise of one tola gold

Hyderabad, Jan 27 (IANS): Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy has directed the officials to prepare an estimated budget to provide one Tola Gold as well as one lakh cash through Kalyanamastu

Hyderabad, Jan 27 (IANS) The Chief Minister said his government is committed to take up the caste census as per the promise given to the people before the Assembly elections. He held a review meeting on BC, Minority and Tribal Welfare departments at the Secretariat here on Saturday

and discussed various issues. During the meeting, officials were also directed to implement the Mahatma Jyothiba Phule Overseas Scholarship scheme more effectively.

"With effective implementation of Overseas Scholarship scheme,

more deserving students can benefit than the present. Based on the rankings of universities abroad, top universities should be identified and a framework should be prepared. Students who are going to study in these universities should be advised to give first priority to avail the benefits of the scheme," Revanth Reddy told the officials.

The Chief Minister also said all educational institutions of SC, ST and BC welfare and Gurukul should be set up as an integrated education hub instead of being separated at different places. Moreover, the proposals should be prepared to build an integrated hub for the each Assembly constituency, he said and asked the officials to identify suitable places for the construction of education hub in all the Assembly constituencies. "If it is not possible to construct an integrated education hub at the constituency level, the land should be identified at another town or mandal center in the same segment as an alternative," he said.

KTR asserted The BRS working president claimed that communal tension has resurfaced due to the Congress returning to power, citing recent incidents in Sangareddy, Nalgonda, and other places on January 22.

Telangana among high prevalence States for child marriages

: With Telangana figuring among high prevalence States for child marriages in the country, with the State's average being higher than the machinery is taking steps to end the practice by 2030. Telangana is one among eight States where the prevalence of child marriage is high. According to the report of Na-

Hyderabad, Jan 27 (IANS) tional Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) 2021, the number of child marriages reported in Telangana were 25 in 2017, 24 in 2018, 35 in 2019, 60 in 2020 and 57 in 2021. As per the National national average, the State Family Health Survey 5 (NFHS 2019-21), Telangana's child marriage average stood at 23.5 percent against the national average of 23.3 percent. Keeping this in mind, the State government has intensified efforts to ensure that minor children

in the State were not married before the legal age. Recently, the Women and Child Development (WCD) department, State Legal Services Authority (SLSA) and TS Commission for Protection of Child Rights (SCPCR) along with Bachpan Bachao Andolan (BBA) discussed the various challenges and solutions in combating child marriage and child sexual abuse.



Ram, Sita had meat and parotta, writes CP1 Kerala Legislator, withdraws post after protest

Kochi, Jan 27 (IANS): Following strong protests from several quarters, first time CPI Legislator from Thrissur, P Balachandran on Saturday apologized for a controversial social media post on his Facebook page where he said that Lord Ram, Laxman and Sita ate meat and parotta (layered flatbread).

Balachandran's post appeared on Saturday evening and after a few hours he himself withdrew it.

In a note that he put out on Saturday he rendered an apology for putting up the post. He added that he at times pens stories and he had put up one such on his social media space that he wrote long ago, but after his friends and wellwishers informed him that it might hurt Hindu sentiments, he withdrew the same. The Thrissur District BJP President, KK Anish Kumar said, "Such offensive things can only be written by a Communist who has scant respect for our culture and they will go to any extent to get a few votes from those who propagate terrorism."

NMC's advice to nix bond policy based on 7 case studies; of them 3 are from MP

Bhopal, Jan 27 (IANS): The National Medical Commission's (NMC) recommendation to states and Union Territories to scrap the 'seat-leaving bond' policy in medical colleges has been made on the basis of seven case studies brought before it between 2020 and 2023.

Out of these seven cases studies, three are from Madhya Pradesh as the state Government has fixed a bond amount of Rs. 30 lakh for students who wish to leave their course midway. This policy is prevalent in both government-run and private medical colleges. Out of the three case studies from Madhya Pradesh, one is the tragic case of Dr. Aakanksha Maheshwari, a 24-year-old junior doctor from Gwalior. Dr. Aakanksha Maheshwari was pursuing her PG in paediatrics, and wanted to quit mid-session. She committed suicide at her hostel room in Bhopal's Gandhi Medical College (GMC) in January 2023, as she was unable to pay the bond amount of Rs 30 lakh. In her suicide note on WhatsApp, Dr. Maheshwari had written to her father, "Sorry Papa, if I had money, I could have left the seat.'

The second incident from Madhya Pradesh that became a part of the NMC's case study took place in 2020. An MS general surgery student wanted to take leave as his father had been hurt in an accident and had been hospitalized. However, instead of helping or being sympathetic to his cause he was threatened by his seniors either to provide a substitute or resign. According to the NMC's notification issued to the Principal Secretary, Health, Madhya Pradesh Government on January 19, "The student had to resign under mental stress after paying Rs. 30 lakh."

The NMC's notification, a copy of which is available with the IANS further read, "The student re-



joined the college later by signing a fresh seat-leaving bond." In the third case related to a medical college in Madhya Pradesh, a female student from the Northeast who was pursuing MS general surgery faced mental harassment due to ragging and a toxic working environment. She had to leave the course midway after paying a hefty amount of Rs. 30 lakh as 'seat leaving bond' in 2022, which was against the principles of natural justice.

Therefore, the NMC's recommendation for scrapping the 'seat-leaving bond' comes as a ray of hope for medical students pursuing their MBBS or PG degrees in Madhya Pradesh and around the country. The concept of seat leaving bond was started to secure commitment, discourage abrupt resignations, and address the issue of seat blocking and wastage of medical seats. The NMC's study also includes two incidents from medical colleges in Maharashtra, and one each in Uttar Pradesh and Telangana. Medical students including junior doctors in Madhya Pradesh have been demanding nixing of the bond policy for several years as it has affected the lives of many medical students. The MP Government, however, is yet to make any announcement in this regard. A junior doctor in Bhopal's Gandhi Medical College, the biggest medical institution of Madhya Pradesh, Dr. Akash Soni, who is also pursuing his PG, told IANS, "In April 2023, we submitted our recommendation to the state government saying that students should be given ample time to decide after first counseling. Now, let's see what the state government



Ahmedabad Police seize illegal e-cigarettes, arrest two

Ahmedabad, Jan 27 (IANS): In a crackdown on illegal e-cigarettes, the Ahmedabad crime branch police in Kalupur arrested two men for possessing contraband worth Rs 9.42 lakh. The operation unfolded in the bustling area of Gandhi Road in Ahmedabad. Acting on a tip-off about a suspect transporting ecigarettes near Valanda Ni Haveli on Gandhi Road, the police initiated surveillance of the specified location. Their vigilance paid off when they spotted a man, later identified as Azim Shaikh, 25, from Kalupur, carrying a bag full of e-cigarettes.

Shaikh, upon questioning, revealed that he had acquired the e-cigarettes from a store on Gandhi Road. Furthering their investigation, the police conducted a raid at Arihant Kitchen, where they uncovered a significant stash of e-cigarettes.

A total of 628 e-cigarettes, valued at approximately Rs 9.42 lakh, were recovered from the premises. The shop, located in the heart of the city, is owned by Manoj Maniar, a 34-year-old resident of Meghaninagar.

Toll-free Mumbai Coastal Road Project 85% done; may partly open by Jan-end

Mumbai, Jan 27 (IANS): The upcoming Mumbai Coastal Road Project (MCRP) first phase is 85 per cent completed even as a part of it is likely to be opened for traffic by the month-end, while the entire project is slated for completion by May, officials said here on Saturday. In a status report, the BrihanMumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) said the MCRP is 10.58 kms, with 8-lanes running from the Princess Street Flyover on Marine Drive till the southern end of the Bandra Worli Sea Link, with 6 lanes inside the tunnel segment,

and a dedicated lane for bus in both directions. The project is costing Rs 13,984 crore, comprising Rs 9,384 crore construction cost and the remaining as administrative charges, physical, water, sewerage, cost contingencies, supervision, compensation paid for mangroves, shifting utilities, etc. Of the total work in the first phase, the progress is 84.08 per cent (physical) and 79.84 per cent (financial), tunnel boring (100 per cent), land reclamation (97 per cent), constructing a 7.47 kms long sea wall (84 per cent).





Teen couple held in Lucknow for robbing people to collect money for their wedding

Lucknow, Jan 27 (IANS): A young couple has been arrested for snatching bags, phones and other valuable items in Lucknow in order to collect money for their wedding.

The couple have been arrested, along with their aide, who used to stand guard near the crime scene to alert them. He posed as a cop. The three have been identified as Shivam Rai, Himanshu Yadav and Khushi (all of them aged 19), and they had recently come to Lucknow from Ghazipur. Shivam has a criminal history with seven cases against him while his girlfriend, Khushi, and their aide, Himanshu, have three cases each against them.



SC shields Umar Ansari from arrest in 2022 hate speech case

The Supreme Court on Saturday granted an interim protection from arrest to Umar Ansari, son of gangster-turnedpolitician Mukhtar Ansari, who was chargesheeted by Uttar Pradesh Police for allegedly giving hate speech in a rally during the 2022 Assembly polls. A bench presided over by Justice Hrishikesh Roy took note of the submission made

New Delhi, Jan 27 (IANS): by senior advocate Kapil Sibal, who appeared on behalf of Umar Ansari, that the alleged inflammatory speech was given by the petitioner's brother -- Abbas Ansari. Further, the bench, also comprising Justice Prashant Kumar Mishra, noted that Abbas Ansari along with a co-accused have already been granted regular bail by the trial court.

After hearing the submissions, the apex court ordered: "Issue notice returnable within a period of four

weeks. In the meantime, the petitioner is protected from arrest." In December 2023, the Allahabad High Court rejected the anticipatory bail application filed by Umar Ansari -- who was co-accused for allegedly threatening government officials with payback at a public meeting stage in the Pahadpur area of Mau during the elections. Mau Police, in March 2022 booked the Ansari brothers under section 171F (offence of undue influence or personation at an election) and 506 (criminal intimidation) of IPC, after a video of the speech went viral on social media.

Earlier in July last year, the Supreme Court had declined to quash criminal proceedings against Umar Ansari and asked him to apply for discharge before the trial court. He had contended that he was charged for merely sharing the stage when his brother allegedly made the controversial speech in violation of the Model Code of Conduct (MCC).

CM Vijayan plays down Guv's one-minute address in Kerala Assembly

Thiruvananthapuram, Jan 27 (IANS): After Kerala Governor Arif Mohammed Khan completed his address to the state Assembly on Saturday in a minute, Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan said "it need not be seen as an act of confrontation" and sought to play it down. CM Vijayan said this at the legislature party meeting of the ruling Left which was held at the state CPI(M) party headquarters here.

The CM said in the meeting that as per the rules a governor needs to read only the first and last paragraph and Khan has done that, hence it can be allowed. He further said,

"Maybe the Governor had some health issues, which we may not know."

Incidentally, the tension between Khan and the ruling Left Front has been prevailing for a while now. On Thursday, the Governor arrived at the state Assembly for his customary address on the first day of the session in the New Year but read only the last paragraph of the more than 60-page address. The two have been at loggerheads

for a while and have been taking on one another in public space and it continued on Thursday when Khan arrived at the foyer of the Assembly. Though he was greeted by Vijayan and his entourage, what was evident was everyone



except Khan and Vijayan were in smiles. As soon as Vijayan handed over the bouquet to Khan, he quickly gave it to his aide and with a grim face walked into the floor of the Assembly.

After reading the opening statement that he is pleased to address

the House, he said, "now, I am going to read the last paragraph..." And after reading the last paragraph, Khan took leave and when he was escorted back to the foyer, Khan and Vijayan did not look at each other.

SDM dismissed after a woman staffer ties his shoelaces in Madhya Pradesh

Divisional Magistrate (SDM) in Madhya Pradesh was on Saturday dismissed after a photograph showing a woman employee tying his shoelaces surfaced on social media. The officer in question, Aswan Ram Chiravan

FOR INDIAN SPACE INDUSTRY, 2024 IS A YEAR OF BIG **EXPANSION AND NEW MISSIONS**

s Finance Minister presents her interim budget for 2024-25 on February 1 this year, she has to keep in mind that this year promises to be a watershed year for India's space exploration! The year, 2024, has been marked as 'The Year of Gaganyaan' by Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) chief S Somanath, who elaborated on the Gaganyaan timeline. At this critical juncture in the planning and implementation of this historic space project, ISRO has scheduled important mission-related tests and demonstrations throughout the entire year. The NASA-ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar (NISAR), a collaborative effort between NASA and ISRO, is also scheduled for launch in 2024. Besides NISAR, ISRO has many other ambitious projects lined up. A communications satellite in the Indian National Satellite System series, INSAT-3DS, is a key to meteorology and disaster management studies. Enhancing India's remote-sensing capabilities, RISAT-1B and Resourcesat-3 are work-in-progress. TDS01 and SPADEX are also expected to contribute to technological research and experiments for Moon missions.

Union Minister for Science and Technology Jitendra Singh has gone on record, saying that the Indian space sector was projected to grow at a rate of 6%-8% over the ensuing year. This year, the stakeholders in India's space sector will keep a sharp watch on the Budget outlay for the space sector, which stood at Rs 12,543.91 crore in the Budget estimates for 2023-2024 as a cumulative allocation made for the Department of Space (DoS)—the government watchdog for the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO), New Space India Limited (NSIL) and Indian National Space Promotion and Authorisation Centre (IN-SPACe), which have provided a platform for greater private sector participation. Singh had said in a written reply to the Lok Sabha at end-December 2023 that the Budget allocation for the DoS had doubled in 2023-2024 (Rs 12,543.91 crore) compared to that in 2013-2014 (Rs 6,972 crore). Also, the revenue garnered from satellite launches from 2003 to 2013, which stood at only \$15 million, had grown to \$157 million from 2014 to 2023 with 396 foreign satellites and 70 domestic satellites launched. The satellite services segment is estimated to account for 36% of India's space economy by 2025, with the ground segment accounting for 31%, the satellite manufacturing segment 25% and the launch services segment 8.15%. The lion's share of the total allocation of Rs 12,543.91 crore, an amount of approximately Rs 11,669.41 crore, was listed for central sector schemes and projects—including the human spaceflight centre and various institutions within DoS handling launch vehicle and satellite projects covering both development and operations. However, there was a slight reduction of nearly 8% in the fiscal 2023-2024 Budget, compared to the Rs 13,700 crore for fiscal 2022-2023, witnessing a 32% reduction in the allocation for space science—including Chandrayaan-3, Aditya L-1 and ISRO's Climate and Atmospheric Programme—compared to the previous Budget estimate. This even gave the Opposition to troll Prime Minister Narendra Modi while he congratulated Somanath and the ISRO team for the very successful landing of Chandrayaan-3 on the Moon's south polar region! India's space economy is now valued at about \$8.4 billion—a share of 2%-3% of the global space economy. Riding piggyback on the twin contributions of the private space sector and the Indian Space Policy (ISP), 2023, the Indian space economy is estimated to be valued at \$44 billion by 2033, Singh further said. The ISP encourages end-to-end space solutions encompassing satellite manufacturing, launch vehicle production, satellite services and ground system manufacturing, although the 'Space Policy' unveiled by the Centre focuses mostly on satellite launches and associated infrastructure.

Rajiv and Rahul had similar political and personal experiences, and both started their political careers on a high note. However, Rajiv's political education came from learning on the job. Four years after entering politics, Rajiv became the Prime Minister due to unforeseen circumstances. While he was out of power, Rajiv learned his political lessons well. Rahul is still learning.

In 1989, Rajiv Gandhi was targeted by his political opponents through negative campaigning, leading to his political downfall. Several notable members, including Arun Nehru, Arun Singh, V.P. Singh, and Amitabh Bachchan, left Rajiv's team during this period. Rajiv's trusted friends were from the Doon School, collectively known as the Dosco team. Rahul's team of image makers put much effort into presenting him as a capable leader. He is credited with creative solutions to address issues related to religion, caste, and economy and to bring India together towards progress. However, the BJP attempted to present him as an inept and entitled leader who lacked vision and could not lead the country towards prosper-



ity. They often called him "pappu" to reinforce this negative perception. Frustrated with the continuous electoral losses, most of Rahul's inner circle sought greener pastures. They belonged to influential political dynasties and were ambitious. They were in a hurry to take over from the old guard. After enjoying power, most of his handpicked team left.

For instance, Jyotiraditya Scindia, a close friend of Rahul Gandhi, was disappointed when the Congress leadership did not appoint him as the Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh after the 2018 Assembly polls. As a result, he played a significant role in toppling the Madhya Pradesh government, eventually leading to establishing the BJP government two years ago. Scindia was offered a ministerial position in the Centre for his support. Recently, Jitin Prasada has joined the Yogi government in Uttar Pradesh. At the same time, Kapil Sibal, Alpesh Thakur, and R.P.N Singh have all moved to different parties. Moreover, Ghulam Nabi Azad has ended his relationship with Congress due to his dissatisfaction with Rahul Gandhi's leadership.

Captain Amarinder Singh left the Congress Party in Punjab and established a new political party.

WINE INDUSTRY OUTLOOK PERKS UP WITH MAHARASHTRA REINSTATING TAX REBATE

The Maharashtra govern ment has decided to re vive a tax-rebate scheme, which was withdrawn in the wake of Covid-19 in 2020. This scheme provides the wineries using grapes grown within the state a refund of 16% of the 20% VAT they pay. The decision would be enforced retroactively, covering the last four financial years - from 2020-21 to 2023-2024.

Jagdish Holkar, the president of the All India Wine Producers Association (AIWPA), stated, "The scheme's revival will be a big relief for us, as it has been the bread and butter for the wine industry. It is part of a farmercentric policy being promoted by the state government." As per estimates, Maharashtra wineries pay Rs 80 crore in VAT annually. Now, they are going to receive 80% of it in refunds. Sula Vineyards which is the biggest among the Indian wineries is expected to receive up to \$40 crore in tax refunds annually. As the decision is being retroactively, it could be a quite a windfall for the wineries. The Wine Industrial Promotion Scheme (WIPS) that provides incentives to wineries by returning 16% of the 20% VAT charged will be in force for the next five years.

Russia calls for emergency UNSC meeting after downing of plane

United Nations, Jan 27 (IANS) : Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov has said that Russia has called for an emergency meeting of the UN Security Council (UNSC) after the downing of a Russian plane carrying captured Ukrainian soldiers.

At a press conference at the UN headquarters in New York, Lavrov said Moscow requested

Lavrov said an air defence missile launched by Ukraine from the Kharkiv region downed the plane in the Belgorod region. The IL-76 was carrying the 65 captured Ukrainian soldiers from Moscow to Belgorod for a prisoner-of-war swap that had been agreed on between Moscow and Kiev.



Sri Lankan cabinet nod for FTA with Thailand

Colombo, Jan 27 (IANS): Sri Lanka's cabinet has granted approval to sign a free trade agreement (FTA) with Thailand, the government's information department said on Saturday. A complete 14-chapter draft FTA was prepared after nine rounds of discussions between the two sides, Xinhua news agency reported. The department, in a statement said the development of supply capacity, attracting export-oriented foreign direct investment and expanding international market access for Sri Lankan goods and services had been identified as strategies essential for the country's economic growth. The National Trade Negotiations Committee has also exchanged views with all relevant local stakeholders during the negotiation process.



EU forms port alliance to fight drug trafficking

Brussels, Jan 27 (IANS): The ties and EU ports is vital," launched the European Ports Alliance Public Private Partnership, aimed at bringing all stakeholders together to protect ports from drug trafficking and criminal infiltration. The alliance was being launched in conjunction with the Belgian Presidency of the Council of the European Union (EU), member states, ports authorities, European associations, EU anti-crime agencies, customs and law enforcement authorities, Xinhua news agency

The vast majority of illicit drugs into the EU are trafficked along maritime routes and 70 per cent of drug seizures are in EU ports, according to Ylva Johansson, Commissioner for Home Affairs. "That is why cooperation between national and EU authori-

European Commission has Johansson said in a press release on Saturday.

The Commission said the launch comes against a backdrop of "criminal networks using extreme violence, corruption and intimidation in their search for profits." Seizures of cocaine in the EU are at record levels, with more than 300 tonnes seized on an annual basis in recent years, said the Commission.

In Belgium alone, authorities seized a record 121 tonnes of cocaine at the Port of Antwerp-Bruges in 2023, a 10 per cent increase over the previous year.

EU figures show that ports contribute to 75 per cent of EU external trade volumes and 31 per cent of EU internal trade volumes, making them vulnerable to drug smuggling and exploitation by high-risk criminal networks.

Delhi HC imposes penalty on husband for false rape allegations, cautions against frivolous complaints

New Delhi, Jan 27 (IANS): The Delhi High Court has imposed a penalty of Rs 25,000 on a husband who sought the registration of a purportedly false rape case against his wife's cousin, cautioning against frivolous complaints that could potentially harm innocent individuals.

The husband alleged that the cousin had raped his wife, who vehemently denied the accusations. Justice Anoop Kumar Mendiratta stated that prima facie, the husband initiated the proceedings with ulterior motives, aiming to gain an advantage in ongoing matrimonial proceedings against his wife.

The court stressed that the criminal justice system should not be burdened by baseless complaints and that the provision of Section 156(3) Cr.P.C. should not be misused. The husband challenged two court orders -- one from a Magistrate and another from a Sessions Court -- that had declined to direct the registration of an FIR against the cousin using Section 156(3) of Cr.P.C.

Growth in banks' credit surpassing deposits: RB1

The gap between credit and deposit growth of banks as of the first fortnight of January 2024 has widened compared to the

Mumbai, Jan 27 (IANS): last fortnight of September 2023, according to the latest RBI data. As on January 12, 2024, year-onyear credit and deposit growth stood at 19.93 per cent and 12.84

per cent respectively, which reflects a gap of 7.09 percentage points, RBI data on scheduled banks' statement of position in India shows. During the reporting

2024, scheduled banks' credit outstanding increased by Rs 10,277 crore while deposits declined by Rs 98,848 crore, according to the statement. "Healthier balance sheets have facilitated broad-based expansion in lending by banks. Bank credit growth continues to outpace deposit growth on the back of sustained momentum of demand," the RBI said in its last Financial Stability Report (FSR). The RBI noted that rising interest rates have benefited banks and improved their net interest margins (NIM), as the transmission to yield on assets has been faster than that to the cost of funds. "Nevertheless, as the rate cycle approaches its peak, banks' profitability is expected to come under pressure due to rising valuation losses, increasing risks for asset quality and tempering of credit growth," the RBI said.

Yes Bank posts 4-fold jump in net profit for Oct-Dec quarter

Mumbai, Jan 27 (IANS): Private sector lender Yes Bank on Saturday reported an over 4-fold jump in net profit to Rs 231.6 crore for the October-December quarter of the current financial year.

The bank had posted a net profit of Rs 51.5 crore in the same quarter of the previous year.

Net interest income (NII), which is the difference between interest received on loans and that

paid on deposits, increased 2.3 per cent year-on-year.

The bank's operating profit grew 5.4 percent to Rs 864 crore during the quarter.

The gross non-performing assets (NPA) of the bank remained at 2 per cent, showing no change from the previous year while there was a marginal improvement in the net NPAs which dipped to 0.9 per cent from 1 per cent in the same period last year.



FPIs sold equities worth Rs 27,000 crore in January

New Delhi, Jan 27 (IANS): FPIs continued to be sellers in the cash market having sold equity worth Rs 27,664 crores through January 25, said V K Vijayakumar, Chief Investment Strategist, Geojit Financial Services.

FPIs were sellers in autos and auto ancillary, media and entertainment and marginally in IT. They bought oil and gas, power and selectively in financial services, he said.

The rising bond yields in the US is a matter of concern and this has triggered the recent bout of selling in the cash market. The rally in global stock markets was triggered by the Fed pivot which saw the 10-year bond yield falling from 5% to around 3.8%. Now the 10-year is back at 4.18% which indicates that the Fed rate cut will come only in H2 of 2024, he said.

As per a report by Kotak Institutional Equities, listed funds witnessed inflows of \$2 billion, completely led by ETF inflows. Indiadedicated funds witnessed inflows of \$3.1 billion, broken down into \$2 billion of ETF inflows and \$1.1 billion of non-ETF inflows, whereas GEM funds saw \$247 million of outflows, led by \$337 million of non-ETF outflows, offset by \$90 million of ETF inflows. Listed emerging market fund flows were mixed. South Korea, Indonesia and Taiwan witnessed \$3 billion, \$262 million and \$76 million of outflows, respectively.

New Delhi, Jan 27 (IANS): Flipkart co-founder Binny Bansal has officially exited the e-commerce platform's board after more than 16 years. Sachin Bansal, the other co-founder, left the board in 2018. After leaving Flipkart, Sachin founded Navi, a financial services firm.

"Flipkart is in a robust position, with a strong leadership team and a clear path forward, and with this confidence, I have decided to step aside, knowing the company is in capable hands," Binny said in a statement. "I wish the team the best as they continue to transform experiences for customers, and I remain a strong supporter of the business," he added. Flipkart Group CEO Kalyan Krishnamurthy said in a statement on Saturday that the company is the outcome of a

great idea and a lot of hard work, built by teams committed to transforming how India shops.

"We wish Binny the best as he embarks on his next venture and thank him for the deep impact he has enabled for the Indian retail ecosystem," he added. Earlier this month, Binny announced a new venture called 'OppDoor', which will help e-commerce companies expand operations globally by providing them with end-to-end solutions. As per reports, OppDoor will initially focus on ecommerce companies in the US,



Canada, Mexico, the UK, Germany, Singapore, Japan, and Australia. Last year, Bansal sold his remaining stake in Flipkart and received about \$1-\$1.5 billion from his shareholding in Flipkart. Binny, along with Sachin Bansal,

exited Flipkart after selling it to Walmart in 2018 for around \$16 billion. Binny has backed around 60 startups, like Acko, Ather Energy, Curefoods, Cultfit, BrightChamps, Unacademy, Yulu and others.


Spotify CEO calls Apple's new EU App Store changes 'extortion'

San Francisco, Jan 27 (IANS): Swedish music streaming service Spotify's CEO Daniel Ek has criticised Apple's proposed App Store changes ahead of the EU Digital Markets Act (DMA), saying the changes are "at best vague and misleading" and a "new low for the company". In a blog post, the Spotify CEO alleged that under the false pretense of compliance and concessions, Apple has put forward a new plan "that is a complete and total farce".

"Essentially, the old tax was rendered unacceptable under the DMA, so they created a new one masquerading as compliance with the law," he argued.

Earlier, Epic Games' CEO Tim Sweeney, whose company sued Apple over antitrust practices, also condemned Apple's plan, saying it was a case of "malicious compliance" and full of "junk fees". Ek said that a completely new 0.50 cent Euro fee per download, every year, in perpetuity, to Apple for just allowing developers to exist on iOS "is extortion, plain and simple".

"If Apple's already charging a commission of 17 per cent (and 10 per cent for recurring payments) on digital goods purchased, why would they also need to charge an annual flat fee for every user?" he argued.

ED grills NCP (SP) MLA Rohit Pawar for 10 hrs, summons him again on Feb 1

Mumbai, Jan 27 (IANS): The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Saturday grilled Nationalist Congress Party (NCP-SP) MLA Rohit R. Pawar for around 10 hours in connection with an alleged money-laundering case, before issuing him another summon for February 1. Rohit R. Pawar, 38, the grand-nephew of NCP (SP) supremo Sharad Pawar, had stepped into the ED office in south Mumbai at around 10.30 a.m. on Saturday. A huge number of party activists from his constituency Karjat-Jamkhed (Ahmednagar), Pune and Mumbai gathered near the ED office where tight security was deployed to prevent any untoward incidents. Amid intense speculation and uncertainty, Rohit Pawar was finally allowed to leave after a 10-hour grilling session. All through the day, Pawar Sr., party's Working President Supriya Sule and other senior leaders maintained an anxious vigil at the NCP (SP) state

headquarters just across the road.

After coming out, thousands of

party workers greeted Rohit Pawar with loud cheers, claps and V-signs. He took a mike to address the gathering, saying that he had fully cooperated with the ED team, answered all their questions, and cleared their doubts. However, he said the ED has summoned him again on February 1 for the probe.

"The struggle is not yet over.... I have been summoned again on February 1. I shall come... I have nothing against the ED officials, they are only doing their duty, " said Rohit Pawar.

He also said that what is going on does not augur well for the country, but the fight must con-

tinue against injustice. "This is a struggle for 'satya' and ultimately the truth will triumph," Sule had said before her nephew entered the ED office for the probe. Meanwhile, Shiv Sena (UBT) Leader of Opposi-(Assembly), Ajay Choudhari, slammed the BJP for the blatant misuse of Central probe agencies against the Opposition parties and leaders.

Digvijaya continues to raise questions about EVMs, says Cong agrees with him



Obligatory for woman to serve her elderly mother-in-law: Jharkhand HC

Jharkhand High Court has observed that in Indian culture, it is an obligation for a married woman to serve her elderly mother-in-law or grandmotherin-law. A woman cannot put pressure on her husband to stay away from his mother and grandmother without reasonable cause, the High Court said giving its verdict in a family dispute case. Justice Subhash Chand was hearing a plea by one Rudra Narayan Rai against an order by a family court, which directed him to pay a sum of Rs 30,000 per month to his wife and Rs 15,000 to his son.

The High Court held that the woman was not entitled to maintenance as she refused to live with her husband without reasonable cause. However, it increased the son's maintenance allowance

from Rs 15,000 to Rs 25,000. The court referred to the funda-

On the other hand, Rudra Narayan Rai said that his wife pressured him to stay away from his mother and grandmother.



All roads lead to Ayodhya for BJP CMs, ministers

Chief Minister of Tripura, Manik Saha will also visit Ayodhya on February 5 along with the cabinet ministers. "A new era of Ram Rajawat or rule of Ram is beginning with the inauguration of Ram Temple in Ayodhya," he said. Upon Saha's request, the railway ministry has allocated three special trains for devotees from Tripura to visit Ayodhya. Arunachal Chief Minister Pema Khandu and Harvana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar will visit Ayodhya on February 6 and 9, respectively, while newly elected Chief Minister of Rajasthan, Bhajan Lal Sharma is all set to reach Ayodhya with his cabinet ministers to seek Ram Lalla's blessing on February 12. 

TN govt to file status report after PIL on water release from Vaigai dam to Melur


Chennai, Jan 27 (IANS): The Tamil Nadu government will file a status report on the release of water from Vaigai dam in Madurai to farmlands in Melur taluk of Madurai district.

This move comes after a directive of the Madurai bench of the Madras High Court on the basis of a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) filed by a farmer.

Farmer B. Stalin in his PIL has drawn the attention of the court to the fact that farmers in Melur taluk were getting water from Periyar dam which reaches Vaigai dam through the Peranai channel and irrigates the farmlands of Melur taluk. Stalin, who is a resident of Ettimangalam village in Melur taluk, in his PIL said that this water was irrigating the farmlands of Melur taluk spread across 1,15,000 acres and that this water was the lifeline of the farmers in the taluk. He said that water was earlier released continuously for 120 days which was necessary for irrigating the farmlands.

In the PIL Stalin said that the water department officials of Tamil Nadu arbitrarily reduced the number of days of the water release from 120 to 90. He charged that this water was not sufficient and that the farmlands would disappear if water was not provided for 120 days continuously. The farmer said that the present storage capacity of Periyar and Vaigai is enough to release water for 120 days and added that if proper directions were not given to the Tamil Nadu government the farmlands would turn into barren land and would become real estate properties.

The Madurai division bench of the Madras high court comprising of Justices D. Krishna Kumar and R. Vijayakumar directed the state government to provide a status report on the situation within one week.



Himachal CM sanctions Rs 100 crore for Shimla's infrastructure

Shimla, Jan 27 (IANS): Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu on Saturday sanctioned Rs 100 crore for enhancing and strengthening infrastructure in Shimla town to increase footfall of tourists and facilitate locals.

He said Rs 55 crore would be spent on underground power cables in Shimla which would ensure proper ducts facilities. 

Ex-CEC Chawla bats for 'one nation one election', says it's challenging

Thiruvananthapuram, Jan 27 (IANS): Effecting drastic constitutional changes with two-thirds majority in Parliament would be the biggest challenge in implementing 'one nation one election', but India can hold simultaneous elections to the Lok Sabha and state Assemblies every five years to substantially reduce the poll expenditure, said former Chief

Election Commissioner (CEC) Navin Chawla. "The reason behind the move is to reduce the cost of elections as well as the frequency of the imposition of the model code of conduct by the Election Commission, which some political parties accuse of impeding development work. However, One Nation One Election (ONOE) will necessitate wide political consultation and major constitutional changes, which are not easy to achieve," wrote the former CEC in an exclusive article for Manorama Yearbook 2024.

Chawla, who was India's 16th CEC, pointed out that the sixday special session of Parliament held in September 2023 and the setting up of a Committee under former President Ram Nath Kovind have once again brought into focus the



issue of simultaneous elections. Pointing out that the issue has been hanging fire for years, he said the issue needs to be examined from the perspectives of the Election Commission of India (ECI), parliamentarians, legislators and voters. From the ECI's point of view, the implementation of ONOE is technically feasible.

Marine heatwaves affect everything from ecosystems to economics and influence weather patterns, priming the environment for tropical cyclones, National Institute of Water and Atmospheric (NIWA) research meteorologist Ben Noll said on Saturday.

Due to the rapidly intensifying marine heatwave, sea surface temperatures had reach a nearrecord 23-24 Celsius in some coastal areas in late January, Xinhua news agency reported. Sea surface temperatures around Auckland, New Zealand's largest city, are borderline tropical, he said





Russia playing with lives of Ukrainian prisoners: Zelensky

Kiev, Jan 27 (IANS) :Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelensky has accused Moscow of playing with the lives of Kiev's prisoners, after a Il-76 military transport aircraft was shot down in Belogorod, the media reported. Zelensky's comment came after Russia claimed that there were no survivors after Kiev downed the plane carrying 65 Ukrainian prisoners, six Russian crew and three escorts, BBC reported.

"It is obvious that the Russians are playing with the lives of Ukrainian prisoners, with the feelings of their relatives and with the emotions of our society," he said.

As Ukraine was not told to ensure safe airspace, as on previous occasions, this can point to Russia's "deliberate" actions

aimed at putting the lives and safety of the PoWs under threat," Ukraine's general staff was quoted as saying by Ukrainska Pravda. On Zelensky seeking an international probe into the incident, Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said it means the Ukrainian President wants an international inquiry into "the criminal actions of the Kyiv regime", and it is definitely needed. The Russian Defense Ministry said that Ukraine knew its prisoners would be transported to Belgorod for an exchange based on an agreement previously reached between the two sides. Kiev's move was an attempt to blame Russia for the deaths of the Ukrainian military personnel on board, said the Russian statement.

Earlier, the main target of the commission's work was alleged interference by China and Russia. Now, India has also been included in its investigation after India-Canada relations nosedived in the wake of Trudeau's allegations against New Delhi in Nijjar's killing. The commission, scheduled to begin its hearings next Monday, will examine all the information about foreign interference in the two elections and make recommendations to stop it. It will submit its interim report by May 3



Colombo, Jan 27 (IANS): Sri Lankan Parliament has passed a bill to regulate online content, drawing criticism by the opposition parties which termed it as serious threat to freedom of speech and crackdown on dissent, ahead of polls in the country, local media reported.

The Speaker said that the Bill was passed on Saturday by a 108-62 vote, the Colombo Times reported. Myanmar Army flies back remaining 92 soldiers from Mizoram

Aizawl, Jan 27 (IANS): Myanmar Army authorities on Saturday took back their remaining 92 soldiers, a day after Myanmarese Air Force aircraft, which came to Mizoram to evacuate them, skidded off the tabletop runway of the Lengpui airport here, injuring eight of the 14 crew members. Officials said that an ATR aircraft of Myanmar Air Force, in two sorties, evacuated the 92 Myanmar soldiers and 14 crew members of Tuesday's plane. "All necessary formalities including collection of biometric details of the Myanmar military personnel have been conducted. Necessary medical support was also given to the soldiers and the eight injured crew members," an official said. The 276 Myanmar Army personnel took refuge in Mizoram's Lawngtlai district on January 17 after their camps were captured by the Arakan Army militants. The Myanmar soldiers, with their arms and ammunition, reached Bandukbanga village, situated on the Mizoram-Myanmar-Bangladesh border trijunction, in Lawngtlai and were taken to Assam Rifles' Parva camp in the district.

"A Myanmar Air Force transport plane from



Mandalay (Myanmar) landed at Lengpui airport on Monday (Jan 22) and evacuated 184 Myanmar soldiers to Sittwe (Akyab) in two sorties and the remaining 92 Myanmar soldiers were supposed to be airlifted on Tuesday but could not done due to the aircraft accident," a senior official told IANS.

Officials said that out of the 14 people who were on board the medium size aircraft along with the pilot, eight were injured, who were immediately rushed to Lengpui hospital and subsequently discharged. UN asks Houthis to reconsider order to expel US, UK nationals

United Nations, Jan 27 (IANS): The United Nations has asked Yemen's Houthi authorities to reconsider their decision to expel US and British nationals working for the world body in Houthi-controlled areas of Yemen.

Stephane Dujarric, spokesman for UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres, confirmed on Saturday that the United Nations has received communications from the Houthis, which gave the world body one month for all US and British nationals to leave the areas under the control of the de facto authorities, Xinhua news agency reported. "What needs to be said is that any request or requirement for UN staff to leave based solely on the nationality of that staff is inconsistent with the legal framework applicable to the UN," said Dujarric. "It also, of course, impedes our ability to deliver on the mandate to support all of the people in Yemen. And we call on all the authorities in Yemen to ensure that our staff can continue to perform their functions on behalf of the UN."

He said UN staff serve impartially and serve the flag of the United Nations and none other.

The spokesman refused to say how many US and British nationals are working for the UN in Houthi-controlled areas of Yemen. "I can find out the number of international staff. We do not give breakdowns of our staff's own nationality," said Dujarric

The order of the Houthi militia came amid rising tensions between the US and British forces stationed in the Red Sea and the Houthis who have been attacking "Israeli-linked ships" in the region since the onset of the Israel-Hamas conflict on October 7, 2023.

The US-UK maritime coalition in the Red Sea has carried out multiple airstrikes on Houthi camps in various northern provinces of Yemen.

Goa to rope in social media influencers to promote tourism, schemes

Panaji, Jan 27 (IANS): The BJP government in Goa has launched empanelment Portal for local social media influencers for promotion of schemes, tourism and policies. Addressing a press conference, Chief Minister Pramod Sawant said that the purpose of the initiative is to promote the schemes, tourism activities and policies among people. "Social Media has become the best influencing platform and hence we have decided to empanel social media influencers,"

he said. Sawant said that content created by the empaneled social influencers will be vetted by the official team and then permission will be given for production.

"The newly launched portal is a pioneering initiative by the Goa Government, making it the second state in the nation to introduce a comprehensive Policy for Social Media Influencer Empanelment," he said, adding Rajasthan was the first state to use such a platform.

Jerusalem, Jan 27 (IANS): Thousands of Israeli women took to the streets across the country, urging their government to sign a ceasefire deal for the release of hostages held in Gaza. In Tel Aviv, protesters on Saturday wearing white temporarily blocked Israel's main freeway, the Ayalon Highway. They held red signs reading, "Stop the bloodshed!" and "Deal now!", Xinhua news agency reported. "We have united to break the silence," the organizers said in a statement. "We take to the streets to choose life before anything else." Israel and Hamas have recently resumed Qatari-brokered negotiations for a ceasefire deal to end the bloody war that started on October 7, 2023.

1st Test: Pope's stunning unbeaten 148 pulls England out of trouble; gives them 126-run lead over India

Top-order batter and vice-captain Ollie Pope slammed his fifth Test century and first in India to pull England out of trouble and helped them take a lead of 126 runs at the end of day three in the first Test at the Rajiv Gandhi International Stadium on Saturday.

Pope, who made just one in England's first innings, stood up amidst a fightback from India to hit an unbeaten 148, laced with 17 boundaries, which guided England to 316/ 6 in 77 overs, the first time a visiting team has scored 300 in a Test match second innings in India since Nagpur 2012.

The day began with England facing the prospect of conceding a lead of 200 runs, but Joe

Australian Open: Bopanna wins men's doubles title with Ebden, becomes oldest major winner

India's Rohan Bopanna made history on Saturday, becoming the oldest man in the Open Era to win a major men's doubles title on Saturday, teaming up with Australian Matthew Ebden to win the Australian

Melbourne, Jan 27 (IANS): Open. The 43-year-old Bopanna and Ebden overcame Italians Simone Bolelli and Andrea Vavassori 7-6(0), 7-5 to clinch the crown at Rod Laver Arena in Melbourne.

Bopanna, who was awarded the Padma Shri by the Indian government for becoming the oldest first-time World No.1 in men's doubles recently, completed his mission to win his first Grand Slam men's doubles title.

Bopanna and Ebden were dominant on serve throughout the one-hour, 40-minute clash, winning 80 per cent (40/50) of points behind their first delivery and not facing a break point to cap a dream week.

Bopanna, who had won his first Grand Slam title, the mixed doubles title alongside Gabriela Dabrowski at the French Open in 2017, and Ebden produced their best tennis at the crucial stages. They found great depth on return in the first-set tie-break to storm ahead before they gained the crucial break of the second set in the 11th

Australian Open : Aryna Sabalenka beats Zheng to win second singles crown in Melbourne

Second-seeded Aryna Sabalenka successfully defended her Australian Open women's singles title, overpowering China's Zheng Qinwen in the final on Saturday to claim her second title in Melbourne Park.

The 25-year-old Sabalenka defeated the Chinese first-time finalists Zheng Qinwen 6-3, 6-2 in a 76-minute encounter to get her name etched onto the Daphne Akhurst Memorial Cup for the second time in her career.

Sabalenka raised her fists and blew a kiss to the sky after sealing victory in cool conditions at Rod Laver Arena on Saturday night. With this victory, Sabalenka became the first player to defend their first ma-

Melbourne, Jan 27 (IANS): jor title since Victoria Azarenka defeated Li Na in the 2013 Australian Open final. The 25-yearold is also the first player to successfully defend an Australian Open crown since Azarenka that year. Like Azarenka, Sabalenka also has career-best Slam performances of a semifinal at Roland Garros, a semifinal at Wimbledon and a final at the US Open. Both players have also reached World No.1. The world No.2 won 84 per cent of first serve points and saved each of the four break points she faced en route to claiming her second singles Grand Slam title with the most dominant performance in an Australian Open women's singles final since Azarenka dropped just three games against Maria Sharapova in 2012.
