Vijayawada, Dec 31 (IANS): Andhra Pradesh Police have booked former minister Perni Venkataramaih, also known as Perni Nani, in the case relating to the alleged diversion of Public Distribution System (PDS) rice. Bandar Taluka Police Station in Krishna district included the YSR Congress Party leader as the sixth accused in the case.

The former minister is likely to be arrested in the case, in which his wife Jayasudha is the prime accused. While Jayasudha has already been granted anticipatory bail by a local court, the police arrested four other accused. The second accused Manasa Teja, the manager of Nani, Civil Supplies Department Assistant Manager



Koti Reddy, rice miller Borra Anjaneyulu and lorry driver Mangarao were all arrested. The four accused were produced before the Machilipatnam Special Mobile Judge late Monday night. The court remanded them to judicial custody for 12 days. The accused were subsequently shifted to Machilipatnam Sub-Jail.

The case was registered in connection with the missing PDS rice from a buffer warehouse owned by Javasudha. An official of the Civil Supplies Department had complained to the police about alleged irregularities in the storage of 248 tonnes of ration rice.

The warehouse in Potlapalem village was registered in his wife's name and was later rented to the Civil Supplies Department as a buffer godown. The facility was under the supervision of Perni Nani and his son Krishna Murthy alias Kittu, During a recent inspection, authorities discovered that 7,577 bags of PDS rice stored

in the warehouse were missing. Summons were issued to Jayasudha, Nani and Krishna Murthy. However, they failed to appear before investigating officials. Jayasudha later approached a court, which granted her anticipatory bail. Perni Nani was added to the list of the accused after police gathered evidence against him during questioning of the four arrested accused.

Hyderabad, Dec 31 (NSS): Minister for Revenue, Housing, Information and Public Relations Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy has announced that in addition to the Reorganisation of sub-registrar offices, modern facilities at the corporate level will be built with CSR funds to provide government services to the people in a more efficient and transparent manner.

The Minister held a meeting with the District Collectors and Registrars of Rangareddy, Hyderabad, Medchal-Malkajgiri Sangareddy at the Secretariat here on Tuesday. The officials were advised to reorganise the Sub-Registrar offices and construct new buildings with these two aspects in mind, with the aim of serving the people and providing them with better facilities. "Currently, there are 144 sub-registrar offices in Telangana, of which only 37 are in their own buildings, while the rest are in rented buildings. The Minister added that KTR ought to be allowed to celebrate New Year's Day, noting that the situation would be addressed on January 3 and 4.

Minister for Irrigation, Uttam Kumar Reddy, and Minister for Roads and Buildings, Komatireddy Venkat Reddy, convened a meeting with officials from the Irrigation department at Jalsaudha here on Tuesday and discussed the progress of irrigation projects under the Nalgonda Lok Sabha constituency. During the review meeting, Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy voiced his frustration regarding the officials' attitudes. He noted that the SLBC project has been a longstanding aspiration for the residents of Nalgonda and cautioned that negligence on the part of the officials could result in the contractors refraining from their duties.

"The contractors should fulfill their responsibilities. The officials must not approach the tasks without due diligence," he stated.

The Minister emphasized that if the officials commit themselves to their work, the project could be completed within the designated timeframe. "The SLBC project is designed to irrigate 4 lakh acres. Both the SLBC Brahmanavellamprojects are of utmost priority to me. Upon the completion of the SLBC, it is anticipated that visitors from around the world will come to witness it. Therefore, it is essential for the officials to approach this project with a profound sense of responsibility," Minister Komatireddy pointed out.

Ponnam Prabhakar advised the Transport department officials to ensure that elected representatives, MLAs and MLCs, IAS and IPS officers participate in each constituency as part of Road Safety Month.

He suggested that RTC and Transport department officials should work in coordination with road safety to create awareness on traffic awareness in every school. Officials were instructed to organise awareness rallies, training classes, workshops, seminars, eye check-up camps, and awareness programmes for drivers on road safety with school stu-

Stating that the Transport department is already undertaking several initiatives to reduce the increasing number of road accident deaths, he directed the officials to complete 50 traffic awareness parks to be set up in every school by January.

The Minister also inquired about the action plan for new buses in the RTC and asked about the progress of the bus depots, including the new jobs to be recruited in the Corporation, which have already been sanctioned for Peddapalli and Eturu Nagaram depots. 1, construction and recurring expenses would lie entirely with the State government. This marked a departure Revanh Reddy, the current from the earlier model, where the Ministry of Defence managed these schools.

In response to this policy shift, the KCR Government took proactive steps, writing to the Ministry, to completely support the Sainik School allocated to the State instead of Telangana State Government bearing the complete expenditure.

Chief Minister, also met with Rajnath Singh, the present defence minister to reiterate this demand. Therefore, I request the Commission to elicit the views of the Government of Telangana and provide clarification on the following points:

Whether the present Telangana Government under the leadership of Revanth Reddy, is willing to bear all expenses related to the establishment of a Sainik School in Telangana as desired by the Defence ministry or whether the State Government is prepared to explore ways to secure grants from the Ministry of Defence for the infrastructure, maintenance and recurring expenditure of these schools.

The ACB has been ordered not to arrest KTR till the verdict is pronounced. It had earlier extended the interim order to not arrest KTR.

KTR had filed the petition in the High Court seeking quashing of the cases registered against him by the ACB in the Formula E-Car racing case. A bench of Justice Laxman heard the petition on Tuesday. Senior advocate Siddharth Dave argued on behalf of KTR. He said Section 409 did not apply to KTR in this case and added that there was no misappropriation of funds in the Formula E-car race case.

National Policy Framework on Agricultural Marketing draft silent on MSP: Punjab

Chandigarh, Dec 31 (IANS) ernment statement said. : Noting the draft policy of the National Policy Framework on Agricultural Marketing is silent on the minimum support price (MSP), the most crucial for the state farmers, Punjab on Tuesday said it "is minutely studying it and is in no mood to leave any of its clauses unconsidered".

A team of officers and agriculture experts "is even decoding the message in between the lines", a state govPunjab Agriculture Minister Gurmeet Singh Khudian, along

with Punjab Mandi Board Chairman Harchand Singh Barsat and officers, conducted a brainstorming session with 'arthiyas' (commission agents) and rice millers of the state seeking their inputs and suggestions on the draft of the policy.

During the discussions, it came to the fore that the draft policy "is totally silent on the MSP, which is the most crucial for the farmers

and the clause regarding promoting the private markets will lead to overshadowing the Agricultural Produce Market Committee (APMC) markets", the statement said. The meeting apprehended that once the APMC markets fall into disarray, it would lead to exploitation of the farmers and traditional traders.

The minister said the rural development fund (RDF) and market development fund (MDF) "are crucial for maintaining state's extensive agricultural infrastructure, especially market infrastructure and maintaining roads connecting these marketing yards to villages". He appealed to the 'arthiyas' led



by Vijay Kalra and Ravinder Singh Cheema and millers led by Tarsem Saini to send their inputs and concerns to the Punjab Mandi Board so that it could be incorporated in the reply to be sent to the Union government. Minister Khudian reiterated the state government is committed to protecting the interests of the farmers of the state and will do everything possible to safeguard the farmers' rights.

being on January 14, and then, it will close after a few days.

To manage the milling crowds, the timings also have been altered as the temple opens every day at 3 a.m. and closes at 1 p.m. and then,

DECODING DISSANAYAKE'S INDIA VISIT: ARE DELHI-COLOMBO TIES BACK ON TRACK?

ri Lankan President Anura Kumara Dissanayake's recent trip (15-17th Dec 2024) to India is an important moment in strengthening the ties between the two neighbouring countries. This visit highlights the growing bond and cooperation between India and Sri Lanka. This was his first official trip abroad since becoming President in September, showing his dedication to strengthening economic relations with India while also tackling worries about China's growing role in Sri Lanka. In his meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Dissanayake thanked India for helping stabilize Sri Lanka's economy during its 2022 crisis. He also shared his vision for working together on economic growth, focusing on sustainable development and recovery. The visit ended with a joint statement that highlighted various plans for working together, including partnerships in energy and efforts to strengthen regional security. India's plan to provide liquefied natural gas (LNG) to Sri Lanka and work on renewable energy projects shows its continued support in helping Sri Lanka expand its energy options. One key announcement was the plan to build an energy pipeline linking India and Sri Lanka, with support from the United Arab Emirates.

This pipeline, along with plans to develop Trincomalee (a port city in Sri Lanka) into a regional energy hub, shows India's aim to strengthen its presence in the Indian Ocean while helping Sri Lanka meet its urgent energy needs. Both countries also stressed the need to restart the passenger ferry service and repair important infrastructure, like the Kankesanthurai port (located in northern Sri Lanka, about 60 km from India), to improve connectivity between the two nations. India's ongoing efforts to support housing, transportation, and digital infrastructure in Sri Lanka reflect its "Neighbourhood First" policy and its SAGAR (Security and Growth for All in the Region) initiative. The agreements and announcements bring hope for the economic recovery of Sri Lanka and stronger ties between the two nations. However, there are concerns about how they might affect Sri Lanka's independence and control over its economy in the long run.

Criticism has emerged within Sri Lanka, particularly from the Frontline Socialist Party (FSP), a group that broke away from the Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna (JVP). The FSP now plays a significant role in the ruling National People's Power (NPP) coalition. Under the leadership of President Anura Kumara Dissanayake, the NPP has brought a fresh direction to Sri Lanka's political landscape. The rise of the JVP and its coalition, the NPP, marks a major shift in the country's governance. However, the FSP has raised concerns about certain agreements, arguing that they could favour India while negatively impacting Sri Lanka's local workforce, resources, and sovereignty. These criticisms could slow down the progress of the Dissanayake administration. This is notable since his party had frequently criticized former President Ranil Wickremesinghe for his agreements with India. The FSP has expressed concern about plans to turn Trincomalee into an Indian economic hub, warning that this could force over 7,000 families to leave their homes. There are growing concerns about large areas of land being given to foreign projects and the possibility of India getting rights to explore resources in places like Mannar (known for its oil and gas reserves) and Kuchchaveli (famous for its beaches and tourism). People fear this could lead to Sri Lanka's natural resources being used in ways that do not benefit its citizens. Another major worry comes from the revival of the Economic and Technology Cooperation Agreement (ETCA), which Dissanayake had strongly opposed in the past. The FSP has claimed that ETCA's rules for opening up trade in services could allow many Indian professionals into Sri Lanka's job market, possibly taking away opportunities from local workers. With India's large workforce, especially in fields like medicine where many local doctors are already unemployed, Sri Lanka may end up struggling to safeguard jobs for its skilled workers.

NEW WASTE-TO-ENERGY PLANT IN BAWANA THREATENS LIVES OF DELHIITES

new waste-to-en ergy incineration plant is set to be established in Bawana to burn 3,000 tonnes of mixed municipal solid waste daily per day. Currently, Delhi burns 7,250 tonnes of garbage daily across plants in Okhla, Tehkhand, Ghazipur, and Bawana, with plans to expand the capacity of these plants by an additional 5,000 tonnes daily.

In total, the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) aims to burn 15,250 tonnes of waste every day within the next three years, surpassing the city's projected daily waste generation of 13,122 tonnes. Amidst these developments, the new waste-toenergy incineration plant in Bawana has received attention through a public notice issued by the Delhi Pollution Control Committee (DPCC). Titled 'Proposed Waste to Energy Project (30 MW) adjacent to TSDF for Hazardous Waste, Sector 5, Bawana, Delhi, 110039', the project is scheduled for a public hear-



ing on December 27, 2024.

During this hearing, stakeholders will have the opportunity to voice their opinions. The DPCC has also invited suggestions and objections regarding the project, with a deadline for submission by December 26, 2024. However, there has been a lack of effective outreach in the Bawana area, and many residents are unaware of the hearing. This insufficient publicity has raised concerns about local participation and transparency.

This initiative has sparked growing concerns about Delhi's waste management practices and the potential environmental impact of expanding waste-to-energy plants across the city

energy plants across the city.

As Delhi's three landfills are operating well beyond capacity, they are unable to take in more waste. So there has been a shift in recent years to rely on waste-to-energy plants based on incineration technology that are set up and operated by private companies. Designed to incinerate municipal solid waste and generate electricity, such plants were introduced in India after being challenged in other countries due to health, environmental and livelihood concerns. These plants burn waste to produce steam.



YELLOW TAXIS OF KOLKATA AT THE END OF THEIR ROAD

Ambassador taxis, which had come to be synonymous with Kolkata, are at the end of the road. Come March, 2025 most of this nearly 7,000 fleet will be off the road following a Supreme Court order of 2009 together with the fact that Ambassador cars have ceased to be produced.

LABOUR MILITANCY ERUPTS IN NEW YORK IN RUNUP TO THE HOLIDAYS

In the run-up to the holiday season, the diverse, working-class New York City borough of Queens seemed to suddenly erupt with labour militancy. Both the Amazon Teamsters and the Association of Flight Attendants (AFA) took action on December 19 to demand the same thing: that management come to the table with good-

faith bargaining that could lift the living conditions of tens of thousands of working New Yorkers and their families.

The Teamsters began their strike and picket at 6 a.m. at Amazon's DBK4 facility in Maspeth, joining with seven other Amazon locations across the country.

Hundreds of Amazon workers and their allies held signs that read "Amazon: obey the law" and "Amazon is unfair" while chanting and walking a picket that stretched across the garage ramp. Members of other unions, such as the New York State Nurses Association and SEIU 32BJ were present to support them, as well as community activists and a who's-who of Queens progressive politicians.

People's World spoke with Antonio Rosario, Teamsters Local 804 and shop steward for DBK4, about why the workers decided that now was the time. "Amazon refuses to negotiate with the union after we've shown majority recognition in multiple facilities. This is one of the facilities where we reached a supermajority."

The reason for Amazon workers seeking a union are clear to Rosario. "The average driver here [at DBK4] makes between \$22 and \$23 an hour," he explains. "We've got UPS drivers doing the same job, delivering packages, making over \$45 an hour, with

pension, with benefits. If Amazon can make billions of dollars, and so can UPS, they can pay—and they're making more than UPS, I can promise you that."

New York City Comptroller Brad Lander, a candidate for mayor next year, was also out on the picket line. "Amazon is union busting, refusing to recognize the union, refusing to bargain in good faith, refusing to give them the contract they deserve," he told People's World. "We keep this wall of shame in the Comptroller's office that looks at all the companies who do business in New York City, who violate labour law, who cheat their workers of their wages, who have unsafe conditions. Amazon is up at the top of the wall of shame." Lander told People's World that Amazon has five times more Unfair Labour Practice (ULP).

Mongolia to enhance support for wool, cashmere, leather processing industries

Ulan Bator, Dec 31 (IANS): Mongolia is seeking to strengthen its support for the wool, cashmere, and leather processing industries, according to a statement from the presidential press office on Tuesday. As part of the national campaign "White Gold," initiated by President Ukhnaa Khurelsukh, the Ministry of Food, Agriculture, and Light Industry, in collaboration with 10 major commercial banks, signed a financing agreement on Thursday. Under the agreement, enterprises in these sectors are expected to receive 788.9 billion Mongolian tugriks (over 231 million US dollars) in circulating capital and concessional investment loans in the coming year alone, the press office announced. Within the framework of the national campaign, which will run until 2028, Mongolia aims to significantly enhance its cashmere processing capacity.

The Asian country is expected to increase the level of full cashmere processing from the current 20 percent to 40 per cent, and expand exports from 398 million US dollars to 690 million US dollars under the framework of the campaign.





FTA with Philippines set to bolster South Korea's trade portfolio : Trade Minister

Seoul, Dec 31 (IANS): South Korean Trade Minister Cheong In-kyo said Tuesday that South Korea's bilateral free trade agreement (FTA) with the Philippines, set for implementation next week, will help the country further bolster its trade portfolio and contribute to maintaining a stable supply chain. Cheong made the remark during a conference with business representatives, aimed at briefing them on ways to utilize the bilateral FTA, which is set to take effect Tuesday, according to the Ministry of Trade, Industry and Energy.

"As the multilateral trade regime under the World Trade Organization weakens, the significance of FTAs continues to grow," Cheong said. "Accordingly, an FTA with the Philippines, our key trade partner, will help South Korea bolster its trade portfolio."

China vows to smash 'Taiwan independence' moves

Beijing, Dec 31 (IANS): A Chinese military spokesperson on Tuesday condemned US arms sales to Taiwan and vowed to smash any "Taiwan independence" separatist plots and foreign interference. Zhang Xiaogang, a spokesperson for the Ministry of National Defence, made the remarks at a press conference when asked to comment on reports of the arrival of a new type of battle tanks purchased by Taiwan from the United States.

"We urge the US side to abide by the one-China principle and the three China-US joint communiqués, earnestly honour its commitment not to support 'Taiwan independence,' immediately stop arming Taiwan, and cease its dangerous moves that undermine peace and stability across the Taiwan Strait," Zhang said.

Seeking independence by soliciting US support is doomed to failure, and resorting to force to resist reunification leads nowhere, he added, Xinhua news agency reported.

"Several pieces of US weaponry won't be the



'magic straw' that can save a drowning man; they are nothing but easy targets on the battlefield," Zhang said.

"The People's Liberation Army will comprehensively improve its combat readiness, enhance its capability to fight and win, and firmly smash any 'Taiwan independence' separatist plots and foreign interference," he added.

On Wednesday, China had denounced the "negative Taiwan-related content" included in the recent US National Defence Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2025.

Chen Binhua, a spokesperson for the State Council Taiwan Affairs Office, made the remarks at a press conference, adding that the inclusion of such content was an attempt by the United States to further arm Taiwan and stir up trouble in the Taiwan Strait.



South Korea: Investigators summon Yoon to appear for questioning Sunday in martial law probe

Seoul, Dec 31 (IANS): The South Korea's anti-corruption investigation body on Tuesday summoned President Yoon Suk Yeol to appear for questioning this weekend over his brief imposition of martial law. The Corruption Investigation Office for High-ranking Officials (CIO) issued the summons ordering Yoon to appear at its office in Gwacheon, just south of Seoul, at 10 a.m. Sunday. This marked the CIO's third summons after Yoon ignored two previous summonses, including one for questioning on Christmas Day. The CIO has teamed up with the police and the defense ministry's investigation unit to look into allegations Yoon incited an insurrection.



Dara Sakor airport in Cambodia's Koh Kong opens to domestic charter flights

Phnom Penh, Dec 31 (IANS): The newlybuilt Dara Sakor International Airport in southwest Cambodia's Koh Kong province opened to domestic charter flights on Tuesday.

An ATR72-turboprop plane, departed from the Phnom Penh International Airport, successfully landed at the airport and was welcomed by a traditional water salute, marking the first travel by air to the coastal province of Koh Kong. Mao Havannall, minister in charge of Cambodia's State Secretariat of Civil Aviation (SSCA), commended the Coastal Airport Investment Co., Ltd. (CAI) for investing in the project, saying this truly reflected the confidence of investors in Cambodia's peace, political stability and potential for business.

"This is another milestone in the development of the civil aviation sector in Cambodia," he said in a speech during the welcoming ceremony of the first domestic charter flight to the airport, Xinhua news agency reported. He added that the new airport would contribute significantly to the development of economy, tourism and industries in Koh Kong province in particular and in Cambodia in general. SSCA's Undersecretary of State and Spokesperson Sinn Chanserey Vutha said last week that the airport, covering the parcel of 218 hectares in the first phase, was invested by the CAI in the amount of about 200 million US dollars.

Located in the districts of Kiri Sakor and Botum Sakor, the airport is capable of handling seven million passengers per annum in a medium term and its capacity will be increased to 20 million per year in a long term from 2030 to 2050, he added.

5-yr survival rate for cancer patients in S. Korea reaches 72.9 pc : Report

Seoul, Dec 31 (IANS): The five-year relative survival rate for cancer patients, reflecting their likelihood of living compared with the general population, stood at 72.9 per cent, South Korea's health ministry said Tuesday. The latest findings from the 2018-2022 period represent a significant increase from 54.2 per cent recorded during the 2001-2005 period, suggesting cancer patients tend to live longer, likely due to more people undergoing medical examinations, according to the Ministry of Health and Welfare, Yonhap news agency reported. The survival rate for thyroid cancer reached 100.1 per cent, meaning its patients showed a tendency to live longer than the general population. Prostate cancer followed with 96.4 per cent, trailed by breast cancer at 94.3 per cent.

Japan Airlines' system restored after cyberattack

Tokyo, Dec 31 (IANS): Japan Airlines (JAL) said Tuesday that its network system has been restored after a cyberattack earlier in the day disrupted luggage services and delayed some flights. JAL said ticket sales for both domestic and international flights have now been resumed after a temporary halt, adding that no personal information was leaked and no damage was caused by computer viruses. The network disruption occurred at 7:24 a.m. local time, causing problems with baggage check-ins and delays for a dozen flights at several Japanese airports, the airline said. At 8:56 a.m. local time, JAL blocked the data transmission device that was causing the system failure, Xinhua news agency reported. JAL told police that it may have been the victim

of a distributed denial-of-service, or DDoS attack, in which networks are overwhelmed by massive amounts of data from multiple sources over a short period, according to investigative sources.

The company said it was working to counteract the cyberattack and determine its source.

Earlier in the day, passengers at Tokyo's Haneda airport were seen checking their phones and speaking with staff, while there was no significant confusion at Narita airport in Chiba Prefec-



ture. A man in his 30s, travelling from Haneda to Ishigaki Island in Okinawa, expressed concern, saying, "I was able to check in fine, but it's worrying that there's trouble." Meanwhile, a man in his 60s, headed to Matsuyama in Ehime Prefecture, commented, "It's a nuisance during the busy year-end period." Meanwhile, cyberattack occurs when there is an unauthorised action against computer infrastructure that compromises the confidentiality, integrity, or availability of its content. The rising dependence on increasingly complex and interconnected computer systems in most domains of life is the main factor that causes vulnerability to cyberattacks, since virtually all computer systems have bugs that can be exploited by attackers.



Afghanistan won't tolerate any aggression, warns Kabul after Pakistani airstrikes that killed 46

Kabul, Dec 31 (IANS): Acting Afghan Foreign Minister Amir Khan Muttaqi on Tuesday issued a stern warning to Pakistan, urging Islamabad to learn the lessons of history before targetting Afghanistan.

"Afghans will not forget the invasion of their territory, and Pakistani rulers should adopt a measured policy," several reports quoted Muttaqi as saying on Tuesday afternoon during an event marking the 45th anniversary of the Soviet invasion.

During his speech, the foreign minister warned Pakistan to "learn from the fate of the Soviet Union and the United States", emphasising that Afghanistan will never accept invasions.



Madhya Pradesh to translocate 14 tigers to Gujarat, Chhattisgarh, Odisha

Bhopal, Dec 31 (IANS): The Madhya Pradesh government will translocate 14 tigers to Rajasthan, Odisha and Chhattisgarh under the animal exchange programme. According to the state Forest Department, four tigers will be relocated to Rajasthan, two to Odisha,

It has also been my demand since day one that the investigation in this case should be completed, the charge sheet should be filed immediately, the case should be tried in a fast-track court and justice should be given to Deshmukh's family as soon as possible."

"The murder of a young sarpanch in Beed district is extremely unfortunate and equally horrific. Therefore, no one can be supported in this case, even if he is close to anyone. Therefore, the government will not support anyone in this case. The police investigation is underway at full speed to find out the root cause of this



case," said Munde, who is under fire from various sections. Anti-corruption crusader Anjali Damania has targeted Dhananjay Munde over the brutal murder of Santosh Deshmukh. She claimed that there is "solid evidence" of the financial relationship between Munde and Walmik Karad, who she alleged runs a mafia empire in the district.

Congress centenary session: Fake Gandhis flaunting themselves in Belagavi at taxpayers' expense, says Kumaraswamy

Mandya (Karnataka), Dec **31 (IANS) :** Union Minister for Heavy Industries and Steel, H.D. Kumaraswamy, on Tuesday launched a scathing attack on the Congress, alleging that "fake Gandhis are flaunting themselves in Belagavi at the expense of taxpayers' money". Speaking to the media during a DISHA meeting in Karnataka's Mandya, the Union Minister criticised the Congress for the Mahatma Gandhi centenary celebrations in Belagavi.

"The Congress government is

planning programmes under Mahatma Gandhi's name and is spending crores on his centenary events. However, I did not see Mahatma Gandhi's photo anywhere in the posters at the event. Instead, massive cutouts of fake Gandhis have been put up," he remarked. "What we see today is not the original Congress, but a fake Congress. The Congress conducting these programmes in Belagavi is that very fake Congress. After Independence, Mahatma Gandhi himself suggested dissolving the Congress party. That Congress no longer exists.

What we have now is 'Alibaba and 40 thieves' Congress," Union Minister Kumaraswamy said.

He clarified that he had no objection to programmes convened under Mahatma Gandhi's name.

"He (Mahatma Gandhi) fought a united struggle to achieve Independence. But has Gandhi's vision of Ram Rajya been realised in today's governance? Has his dream of Gram Swaraj been fulfilled?" he added. "The Central government has released Rs 448.29 crore from the 15th Finance Commission's grants to develop villages through panchayats.

However, despite months passing since the funds were released, they have still not reached the panchayats," he lamented. He also expressed concern about the poor state of government hospitals in the state. "The condition of government hospitals is pathetic. Due to the lack of quality treatment, there have been repeated deaths of mothers and infants. There are no doctors or nurses in these hospitals. Over two lakh government posts are lying vacant. How can governance be effective in such a situation?" Union Minister Kumaraswamy asked.

Venture capital activity in India from January to November 2024 has surged to US\$ 16.77 billion across 888 deals, reflecting a robust 14.1 per cent increase in value and a 21.8 per cent rise in deal count compared to the same period in 2023, according to figures gathered by the India Brand Equity Foundation (IBEF).

The technology sector emerged as the frontrunner, attracting \$6.50 billion, a remarkable 52.5 per cent increase year-over-year. Consumer discretionary investments followed with \$2.30 billion, up 32.2 per cent, while the financial sector saw a slight decline to \$2.20 billion, the IBEF report said. Noteworthy deals included KiranaKart Technologies (Zepto) at \$1.3 billion and Poolside AI SAS at \$500 million. Industry leaders express optimism about continued momentum into 2025.

Adani Enterprises Ltd's share has potential upside of 57.8 pc in 24 months: **Ventura Securities**

share of Ola Electric fell around 3 per cent on Tuesday after some fresh high-level exits at the company, including its Chief Marketing Officer Anshul Khandelwal and Suvonil Chatterjee, Chief Technology and Product Officer. On Tuesday, the share was trading less than Rs 86 apiece, after falling nearly 3 per cent. Khandelwal and Chatterjee stepped down from their roles at the company, effective December 27, citing personal reasons. Both executives initially joined Ola's ride-hailing business before transitioning to Ola Electric

New Delhi, Dec 31 (IANS): The Mobility. Several top executives of the company have tendered their resignations this year as the company faces mounting pressure. N Balachandar, Group Chief People Officer, left the EV company in November after overseeing HR for Ola Electric, Ola Cabs, and Krutrim AI. In October this year, Ravi Jain, Business Head of Krutrim AI, and Sidharth Shakdher, CBO of Ola Mobility, left the company. After a blockbuster sales figure in October due to the festive season, Ola Electric vehicle registrations dropped by 33 per cent in November. According to Vahan portal data, the number of registra-

tions of Ola Electric vehicles in November fell by 33 per cent on a month-on-month (MoM) basis to 27,746 units. In October last year, this figure was more than 40,000 units. Due to fewer registrations, the company's market share dipped to 24 per cent in November, which was 30 per cent in October. However, the company still maintains the first position in the electric two-wheeler market by sales.

Bhavish Aggarwal-led Ola Electric has seen volatility in sales in recent months. The reasons for this were attributed to increasing competition in the market and poor service and product quality.

Govt's bank guarantee waiver for telcos to boost 4G, 5G networks : Vodafone Idea

Mumbai, Dec 31 (IANS): The government's decision to waive bank guarantees for the telecom industry has come as a major relief and will help to boost 4G and 5G investments in India, according to telecom major Vodafone Idea. Debt-ridden Vodafone Idea (Vi) stated in a regulatory filing that it has received a letter regarding the waiver of bank guarantee from the Department of Telecommunications (DoT). The move comes as a big relief to the debt-ridden telco.

"The waiver is a clear indi-

cation of the government's continued support to the telecom industry. It will ensure that the exposure of the banking system is utilised by telecom operators towards further proliferation of 4G and 5G networks in India," Vodafone Idea said in a statement. The Department of Telecom (DoT), in a communication dated December 27, 2024, has dispensed with the requirement of submission of Financial Bank Guarantees for the spectrum acquired in auction held in 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2021, subject to certain terms and conditions.

Prior to this reform, bank guaran-

tees aggregating to about Rs 24,800 crore were required to be provided by Vi against each spectrum instalment, 13 months prior to the instalment falling due for the above auctions, the company said in a BSE filing.

Other major players such as Bharti Airtel are also expected to gain from the decision. No bank guarantees will be required to be provided by the operator for the 2012, 2014, 2016 and 2021 auctions, Vodafone Idea said in a statement. However, there would be a onetime partial shortfall only for the 2015 auction, where the net present value of all payments



made would be less than the prorated value of the spectrum used, it said. "We are in discussion with the DoT to determine the final amount of this partial shortfall for the 2015 auction," Vodafone Idea said. The moratorium for spectrum auction dues for Vi is ending in October next year and bank guarantees were to be submitted

13 months before the next due payment.

Vi was expected to submit bank guarantees in tranches for different spectrum auctions pre-2022. However, the company did not submit any of the tranches scheduled for September and in the ongoing month.

India-Australia merchandise trade reaches \$16.3 billion in April-Nov

New Delhi, Dec 31 (IANS) : Total merchandise bilateral trade between India and Australia reached \$16.3 billion in the April-November period this fiscal (FY25), the government said on Tuesday. Vallabh urged people to respect the court's verdict and refrain from commenting on it. He also recalled the original



"Jammu and Kashmir, including PoK, is an integral part of India. The BJP is simply trying to distract attention from its failures. They should first clarify their stance on B.R. Ambedkar's statement." Sharma emphasised that the ongoing controversy was an attempt to deflect from real issues.

After Raghubar Das's resignation as Odisha Guv, voices grow for action against his son

New Delhi, Dec 31 (IANS) : Days after President Droupadi Murmu accepted the resignation of Odisha Governor Raghubar Das, criticism has been mounting in the state against the Mohan Majhi-led government, alleging inaction in an assault case involving his son. In July, Raghubar Das's son was accused of assaulting a government employee, Baikuntha Pradhan over not sending a luxury car to receive him at the railway station. It was al-

leged that Pradhan was assaulted and mentally tortured by Das's son and four others at the Governor's House in Puri on July 7 when President Murmu visited the town to witness Lord Jagannath Rath Yatra. Pradhan was posted there to supervise the preparation for the President's visit. On July 10, he lodged an FIR, seeking justice. Soon after the incident, the state government transferred him from the Governor's secretariat

The issue was later raised in the Odisha Assembly where the state government said the Puri district

magistrate was investigating the allegations and would submit a report within a month. Former Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik, who raised the issue in the Assembly, alleged that action was not taken against the accused persons because one of them was the son of the Governor.

Following Das's resignation, the Biju Janata Dal (BJD) on Wednesday renewed its demand for action against the outgoing Governor's son. The party said an investigation was promised into the allegation after the state's opposition




parties raised the demand in July this year. "The government announced an investigation by the Puri district magistrate with a report to be submitted within days. However, this promise remains unfulfilled, and no action has been taken," BJD spokesperson Lenin Mohanty said.

Rajasthan: SI recruitment exam to be cancelled after scandal, re-exam recommended

The committee explored various options, including conducting the exam for the original candidates again, cancelling the recruitment entirely.

Heavy rain expected to bring widespread flooding in Fiji

Suva, Dec 31 (IANS): Fiji has been experiencing relentless rainfall with heavy downpours and flash flooding, with weather systems moving from the Western Division to the Central, Eastern and Northern Divisions in the next few days. People in floodprone areas are urged to prepare for possible evacuation, keep essential items in elevated locations and secure food, water and gas supplies, reported Fiji Broadcasting Corporation on Tuesday. According to the Fiji Meteorological Service, the West of the country had a brief break from torrential rainfall and Christmas Day floods, but the weather situation remains critical as a new weather system is expected to bring in even more rain and flooding. The me-



teorological service has warned of a second slow-moving trough which is expected to bring heavier rain than Wednesday, Xinhua news agency reported. Although the rain is expected to ease by late Friday, the effects of flooding could last for weeks. Weather conditions should improve over the weekend, with clearer skies and a shift in winds. There are currently no signs of tropical cyclone activity but long-range forecasts suggest possible weather developments near northern Vanuatu around New Year's Eve, the Fiji Meteorological Service said.



Tunisia dismantles drug trafficking network, seizes 3.5 kg of cocaine

Tunis, Dec 31 (IANS): Tunisian security forces have dismantled a drug trafficking network active in the capital Tunis, seizing 3.5 kg of cocaine, the Tunisian National Guard said on its Facebook page. National Guard units targeted the criminal network operating in the neighborhood of Ain Zaghouan, the Tunisian National Guard said on Tuesday, without elaborating on the details of the operation and number of arrests, Xinhua news agency reported. The operation followed investigations that resulted in the seizure of an unregistered car parked outside a residence in Tunis. Inside the vehicle, authorities seized 3.5 kg of cocaine.

The Tunisian government has taken a strong stance against drug trafficking, arresting hundreds of individuals suspected of being involved in the crime in recent nationwide operations.

Earlier in December 2024 Tunisian security units have dismantled a drug trafficking network active in the Grand Tunis area.



Yemen's Houthis claim another 'hypersonic ballistic missile' attack on Israel

Sanaa, Dec 31 (IANS): Yemen's Houthi group claimed responsibility on Tuesday morning for launching a longrange 'ballistic missile' toward Tel Aviv. "Our missile force bombed a military target in Tel Aviv by using a hypersonic ballistic missile," Houthi military spokesperson Yahya Sarea said in a statement aired by Houthi-run al-Masirah TV. "Our military operations against Israel will continue until the aggression on Gaza stops and the siege on it is lifted," he said.

Iran cites Israel's confession to assassination as justification for October 1 attack

Tehran, Dec 31 (IANS): Iran's the first time that Israel had assasenvoy to the United Nations (UN) has said that Israel's "clear confession" to assassinating Hamas leader Ismail Haniyeh on Iranian soil justifies Tehran's military response against Israel on October 1.

Amir Saeid Iravani, Iran's Permanent Representative to the UN, made the remarks in a letter addressed to the UN Security Council while reacting to the confession on Tuesday by Israeli Defence Minister Israel Katz, in which he admitted for sinated Haniyeh in Tehran, Xinhua news agency cited a report from Iran's semi-official Tasnim news agency.

Haniyeh was killed on July 31 along with his bodyguard when their residence in Tehran was attacked. Both Hamas and Iran accused Israel of carrying out the assassination.

On October 1, Iran launched dozens of ballistic missiles at Israel, describing the attack as a retaliation for the assassinations of key resistance figures, including

Haniyeh, Hezbollah leader Sayyed Hassan Nasrallah, and senior Iranian commander Abbas Nilforoushan. Speaking at a recent Defence Ministry event, Katz had also issued a warning to Houthi forces in Yemen after their drone attacks, which have been intercepted by Israeli air defence systems.





Bengal Police trying to trace direct links between fake passport and human trafficking rackets in state Kolkata Dec 31 (IANS):

Officials of both the West Bengal Police and Kolkata Police, probing the fake passport rackets in the state, are trying to track the links of these rackets with those involved in cross-border human trafficking, sources said.

The hunch of the investigating official about the possible links between the fake passport and human trafficking rackets was prompted after examining the documents of the fake passports prepared by such rackets, where almost all the beneficiaries were illegal infiltrators. Although the majority of such fake passports were for male illegal infiltrators neighbouring Bangladesh, there were quite a number of women infiltrators for whom such fake passports were made.

Fuel price hike speculation sparks row in Jharkhand, govt denies proposal

Ranchi, Dec 31 (IANS): Protests have started against the alleged preparation by the Jharkhand government to impose a cess on petrol and diesel and the opposition Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has warned it that such a move would be both "suicidal" and "anti-people". A recent media report claimed that the state government is drafting a proposal to impose a cess on petroleum products to generate more revenues. If implemented, this could raise petrol and diesel prices by Rs 2-3 per litre in the state. However, state Finance Minister Radha Krishna Kishore has denied the existence of any such proposal.

Addressing media persons here on Tuesday, he said: "There is no such proposal at the moment. If required in the future, the government will make decisions based on the prevailing situation. Also, we oppose the Central government's intent to impose a tax on aviation fuel, as discussed during the GST Council meeting held recently in Jaisalmer."



Specialised training will be given to Manipur Police to deal with present situation: CM Singh

Imphal, Dec 31 (IANS): Manipur Chief Minister N. Biren Singh on Tuesday said that given the current situation of law and order in the state, the newly recruited constables would undergo specialised training. After visiting the Manipur Police Training Centre at Pangei, Imphal, the Chief Minister, speaking on the sidelines of the inspection, said that the proposed specialised training is essential to enhance the strength and readiness of the police force to ensure safety and security across Manipur.

"We are committed to equipping our police personnel with the best facilities and training to meet any challenges effectively," Singh said. Earlier this week 1,946 newly recruited Manipur police personnel successfully completed their year-long training at Lachit Borphukan Police Academy at Dergaon in Assam's Golaghat district. The Manipur Chief Minister thanked Assam Chief Minister Hianta Biswa Sarma, his colleagues in the government, as well as Assam's Director General of Police G. P. Singh and other senior officials



of the state for providing training to his state's police personnel. According to officials, out of the 1,946 recruits, caste distribution is diverse with 62 per cent being non-tribal Meiteis, 12 per cent are tribal Kuki-Zo and the remaining 26 per cent belonging to Naga and other tribes. "Among the newly recruited police personnel there are people belonging to the Meitei, Kuki-Zo and Naga communities and the government would try to keep them as a united team without dividing them along ethnic lines," Singh said. The Chief Minister said that 1,946 new recruits for the 10th and 11th Indian

Reserve Battalions of Manipur Armed Police were specially raised for highway protection. Considering the present situation in the state and the spirit of discipline shown by the new recruits, barracks were constructed at Pangei, he said. Around 800 to 1000 of the new recruits would be stationed at the temporary barracks where they would undergo further special commando training, he said, adding that they would form special teams to meet any eventuality concerning law and order situation in the state.

Delhi: Kejriwal skips NDMC meet; resolution passed against 'Mahila Samman Yojana'

New Delhi, Dec 31 (IANS): The New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) in its meeting on Tuesday unanimously passed a condemnation resolution against former Delhi Chief Minister and NDMC member Arvind Kejriwal regarding the fraudulent "Mukhyamantri Mahila Samman Yojana" and "Sanjeevani Yojana" launched by the Delhi government. Kejriwal was absent for the fourth straight meeting of the newly-constituted council, the council members took on record. While addressing the media at the NDMC headquarters, Palika Centre, Vice-Chairman Kuljeet Singh Chahal said the council had on May 25, 2022, given in-principle approval for the implementation of the Central government's flagship "Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana" (AB-PMJY) for the residents of the New Delhi area. In that meeting, the then Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal himself was present but now he has been blocking the implementation of this scheme for political gains. "Additionally, he is misleading the citizens of Delhi with fraudulent schemes like the "Mukhyamantri Mahila Samman Yojana" and the "Sanjeevani Yojana". These schemes falsely promise Rs 2,100 per month for women and other benefits for citizens aged 60 years and above," said Chahal. While the Delhi government's Women and Child Development Department and the Health and Family Welfare Department clarified through media and social media that no such official schemes exist.



SADC welcomes court ruling on Mozambique's general elections

Harare, Dec 31 (IANS): Zimbabwean President and Southern African Development Community (SADC) Chairperson Emmerson Mnangagwa welcomed a court ruling that proclaimed Daniel Chapo the winner of the October 9 general elections of Mozambique. "The ruling by that country's top electoral court, which upheld Frelimo party's victory, completes and thus exhausts all lawful processes on determining election results, in line with that country's national laws, and in keeping with SADC's Election Guidelines and expectations," Mnangagwa said in a statement on Tuesday.

He said SADC expects all parties to the electoral process to abide by the decision of the Constitutional Council of Mozambique, noting that the ruling should provide a constitutional way forward for the country and facilitate greater peace, normalcy, and stability in the southern African country, Xinhua news agency reported.

"SADC stands ready to assist the incoming government and the people of Mozambique, in consolidating their electoral democracy on the basis of the aforesaid Court decision which should be held sacrosanct by all," Mnangagwa said.

Mnangagwa also urged the international community to respect the sovereign will of the people and the Republic of Mozambique and encouraged constructive support towards peace, law, and order by all those concerned.

On Monday, Mozambique's Constitutional Council, the body in charge of constitutional and elec-



toral affairs, proclaimed Daniel Chapo the winner of the October 9 general elections. Chapo will take the baton from the incumbent president Filipe Nyusi to become the fifth president of the Republic of Mozambique. As the presidential candidate of the ruling party Frelimo, Chapo has won 65.17 per cent of the votes, less than the 70.67 per cent announced on October 24 by the National Electoral Commission (CNE), according to the data released by President of the CC Lucia Ribeiro in Maputo, the Mozambican capital. Venancio Mondlane, supported by the extra-parliamentary Optimist Party for the Development of Mozambique or Podemos, obtained 24.19 per cent of the votes, higher than the 20.32 per cent announced by the CNE. SADC is a regional economic community comprising 16 member states including Zimbabwe and Mozambique.



Ambush in Syria kills 14 interim govt officers

Damascus, Dec 31 (IANS): Fourteen officers from Syria's interim Ministry of Interior were killed and ten others injured in a "treacherous ambush" in the northwestern province of Tartus on Tuesday, the interim government's Interior Minister Mohammed Abdul Rahman announced. The minister described the attackers as "remnants" of the former government, reports Xinhua news agency, citing local Al-Watan newspaper. Syrian security forces clash with armed locals in northwestern province

Damascus, Dec 31 (IANS): Violent clashes erupted between local armed residents and security personnel from the military coalition led by Hayat Tahrir al-Sham (HTS) in northwestern Syria's Tartus province, a Britain-based war monitor reported. The fighting started in the village of Kharbet al-Ma'zza when locals opposed home inspections by the security forces, prompting armed residents to set fire to a vehicle belonging to the HTS, Xinhua news agency reported quoting the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights.

There were casualties on both sides, it said, adding that the forcements, including specialised division and ambulances, as clashes continued. A large convoy comprising fighters from Unit 82, K9 squads of the military coalition headed to the region near the Latakia province, it said, adding that Syria's new authorities aim to apprehend the armed locals they describe as "remnants of the previous regime" and to prevent any sectarian unrest in the demographically diverse area. The military coalition took control over capital Damascus and most parts of Syria following the fall of Bashar al-Assad's government.

GDP growth of CIS countries to be 4.7 per cent in 2024: Putin

St. Petersburg, Dec 31 (IANS)

: The growth of gross domestic product (GDP) of the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS) members will reach 4.7 per cent this year, Russian President Vladimir Putin said at an informal CIS summit held in Leningrad Oblast. "The macroeconomic indicators of our countries have improved significantly. Thus, by the end of 2024, the growth of total GDP of the Commonwealth countries is projected to reach 4.7 per cent," Putin said Wednesday. He described the figure as "higher than the world average."

Russia's trade turnover with other CIS members in January-October increased 10.6 per cent and amounted to more than 93 billion USD, the president noted, adding that in the 10 months, the industrial production of CIS countries rose 4.3 per cent, the volume of cargo transportation went up 7.4 per cent, and retail sales added by 7.7 per cent, Xinhua news agency reported.

Netanyahu warns Houthis as Israel reportedly mulls new airstrike

: Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu warned that Houthi forces in Yemen would face consequences similar to those experienced by other anti-Israel groups.

"The Houthis, too, will learn what Hamas, Hezbollah, the Assad regime, and others have learned, and even if it understood across the Middle East," Netanyahu said in a video statement.

Earlier on Tuesday, Houthi forces launched a ground-toground missile toward Israel for the second consecutive day. In the evening, they fired a drone, which crashed into an open field in southern Israel, Xinhua news agency reported.

Bird flu tightens grip on California as human cases rise



Sacramento, Dec 31 (IANS): California's battle against avian influenza A (H5N1) intensified amid spreading infections across dairy farms and a growing number of human infection, including two newly confirmed cases in Stanislaus and Los Angeles counties. The virus, commonly known as bird flu, has infected 659 of California's 984 dairy operations since August, with one-quarter of these cases emerging in the past month alone, according to California authorities.

The rapid spread through the state's dairy industry prompted

Governor Gavin Newsom to declare a state of emergency last week to protect agricultural workers and public health, Xinhua news agency reported. "This proclamation is a targeted action to ensure government agencies have the resources and flexibility they need to respond quickly to this outbreak," Newsom said in a statement.

The outbreak's human impact has grown increasingly severe, with California reporting at least 36 confirmed cases -- more than half of the nation's total of 65, according to the latest report by the US Centers for Disease Control (CDC) on Tuesday, though the actual count is likely higher as recent local confirmations may not yet be reflected in federal data. Two new cases were confirmed Monday in California's Los Angeles County and Stanislaus County.

UAE President, Turkish FM discuss ties, regional stability

Abu Dhabi, Dec 31 (IANS): UAE president expressed his hope President of the United Arab Emirates (UAE) Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan met with visiting Turkish Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan on strengthening bilateral ties and addressing pressing regional issues.

S. Korea's childbirths rise by highest rate in 14 years in October

Seoul, Dec 31 (IANS): The number of babies born in South Korea increased by the fastest rate in 14 years in October, data showed on Tuesday, as the country is struggling to address the grim demographic changes posed by its ultra-low birth rate and rapid ageing. According to the data compiled by Statistics Korea, a total of 21,398 babies were born in October, up 13.4 per cent from the 18,878 newborns a year earlier, Yonhap news agency reported.

It marked the largest on-year increase since November 2010, when the number of childbirths grew by 17.5 per cent. "More couples held weddings from the second half of 2022 through the first half of 2023 after delaying their marriages during the earlier stages of the Covid-19 pandemic," said Im Young-il, an agency official. He also noted an increase in the number of second children.

South Korea has been grappling with a persistent decline in its birth rate, as an increasing number of young people are choosing to delay or avoid marriage and parenthood. To encourage marriage and improve the fertility rate, the government has rolled out various marriage benefits and support for child care.
