Manipur Cong file petitions seeking disqualification of 4 NPP MLAs



DECENT JOB CREATION CONTINUES TO BE INDECENT SHOWS EPFO DATA

ecent job creation in India continues to be indecent, if the latest Employment Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) provisional data released on January 20, 2025 is of any indication. The trend of increase in new EPF subscribers remains at very low. A total of 874420 new subscribers joined in November 2024, which was an increase of only 88,244 over the October 2024 figure of 786196. It should be noted that number of new subscribers joining the EPF has been witnessing sharp fluctuation in the current financial year 2024-25, which shows the volatility in the Indian labour market, as far as decent job creation is concerned. The total number of new EPF subscribers in April was 979460, which rose to 1059379 in May, only to rise further to 1086342 in June, and to 1132367 in July. Then there was a sharp fall in August and it came down to 997506. It registered a minor increase in September when new EPF subscribers were 1001308 only to fall sharply to the lowest level to 786196 in October. Number of members exited from EPF shows the really pathetic situation prevailing in the decent job market. Exited members were 849849 in November, 1322899 in October, 1430659 in September, 1446418 in August, 1542493 in July, 1579391 in June, 1613008 in May, and 1637523 in April. Exited subscribers were generally much more than the new EPF subscribers joined. Volatility in the decent job market having social security like EPF is obvious, which meant that labour force is not sure about retaining their jobs. Complexity of the situation has another layer also in which after a troubled time of joblessness, many of the exited employees joined and rejoined again as EPF subscribers. However, Union government has patted its back on the increase of numbers in the net payroll data of EPFO, on account of Number of exited members who joined and resubscribed EPF. In November 2024, a total of 1463089 subscriber in the net payroll data, which included 1438518 exited and rejoined and resubscribed members.

The Union Government's boasting of a net addition of 14.63 lakhs members in November has little meaning, since it does not include the level of distress suffered by the workforce during their exit and rejoining the EPF. Moreover, on an annual basis, it was only a 4.88 per cent rise, which the ministry said it achieved due to uptick in employment opportunities and increase in awareness about employment benefits due to EPFO's "outreach initiatives".

The claim should be seen in the backdrop that EPFO is still not ready with the system to implement the Employment Linked Incentive schemes which were announced in the Union Budget 2024-25, and the government has failed in launching the same. Under the three ELI schemes incentives were to be given to employers and employees for new subscribers. Therefore, almost the entire year 2024-25 has gone wasted on this account. Another area of concern is the data for Establishments remitting first ECR in the month, which shows a declining trend, showing general delay in crediting of EPF contributions to employees' accounts. The number of establishments remitting first ECR in the month were down to 2336 in November, from 5784 in May 2024.

Nevertheless, on the very low base of new EPF subscribers in October, the increase in November was about 16.58 per cent. Compared to November 2023, it was an increase of about 18.80 per cent.

New subscribers joining EPF was dominated by the workers of age group 18-15 years, many of them first time job seekers, in November which stood at 54.97 per cent. In absolute numbers they were over 4.81 lakh. It was an increase of 9.65 per cent from October. On year-on-year basis the increase was 13.99 per cent. As for the net payroll addition of this age group is concerned, it was 5.86 lakh in November, an increase of 7.96 per cent from October.

There was an 11.47 per cent increase in exited EPFO members who rejoined in November compared the October. On year-on-year basis the increase was 34.75 per cent. It was a good trend on part of the employees who did not prefer final settlement of their money deposited with EPFP, but went for transfer of their account with new employers. It shows their hope of finding a decent job, but the percentage is very poor. As for female workforce is concerned, there were 2.4 lakh new EPF women subscribers in November, which was an increase of 14.94 per cent from October. On year-on-year basis it was 23.62 per cent.

The net addition of women workers in EPFO payroll was 3.13 lakh in November which was an increase of 12.16 per cent compared to October, and 11.75 per cent compared to November 2023.

THE FALLING VALUE OF INDIAN RUPEE CAN BE CONVERTED INTO AN OPPORTUNITY FOR GROWTH

n January 13, 2025, the rupee recorded its sharpest singleday decline in nearly two years, finishing the session 58 paise lower at a historic low of Rs 86.62 against the US dollar.

Numerous commentaries are now emerging in popular media, expressing concern that a weakened Rupee could pose challenges for the Indian economy, particularly for Indian industries, as larger companies tend to borrow in dollars. A weaker Rupee also implies higher import costs, which could lead to a widening current account deficit (CAD). Basic macroeconomic theory suggests that a widening CAD will fuel domestic inflation by raising the price of imported crude oil. This could have secondary effects, including a decline in foreign exchange reserves and foreign institutional investors pulling out of the Indian stock market.

Interestingly, the depreciation of

Rupee against the US dollar is not a recent phenomenon. Between 2005 and 2024, the Rupee has, on average, depreciated by around 3.5% annually. An analysis of long-term data suggests that the average annual depreciation of the Rupee was 0.4% between 2000 and 2004.

However, the depreciation accelerated significantly after that, with the rupee depreciating on average by 3.4% annually between 2005 and 2014. This trend remained largely unchanged between 2015 and 2025, with the rupee depreciating on average by 3.5% annually. Now what are the reasons for the Rupee to depreciate? First is inflation. If domestic inflation is higher than the US inflation, the Rupee is expected to depreciate against the dollar. Second is the asset market approach, which suggests that the value of the exchange rate depends on the inflow and outflow of capital into and from the domestic economy.

The local Gorkha communities of Darjeeling, Kalimpong, Terai and Dooars play a key role in maintaining communal harmony and ensuring security in the strategically sensitive areas, the Darjeeling MLA has pointed

out. It is an issue that has to be seen as their urge for dignity, recognition and empowerment, Zimba has argued.

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UN officials express concern over violence in Congo

United Nations, Jan 31 (IANS) : Top UN officials expressed concern about escalating violence in the eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC).

"The situation is deteriorating rapidly," UN Assistant Secretary-General Joyce Msuya told an emergency meeting of the UN Security Council.

She said hundreds of civilians have been killed or injured in the last few weeks, and hundreds of thousands have fled their homes or shelters to escape gunfire and shelling. Tensions have been running high due to the recent advances by the M23 rebels in North

Kivu and South Kivu provinces. The rebels took control of Sake, a town considered the last defence for government forces before Goma, the capital of North Kivu and a major regional hub.

Jean-Pierre Lacroix, UN undersecretary-general for peace operations, said the United Nations is profoundly concerned with the resumption of hostilities which have led to the loss of a strategic position several kilometres from Goma.

World leaders, survivors gather in Poland to commemorate 80th anniversary of Auschwitz liberation

Warsaw, Jan 31 (IANS): Auschwitz survivors and global leaders gathered at the site of the Auschwitz concentration camp in southern Poland to commemorate the 80th anniversary of its liberation. The ceremony drew an array of international dignitaries, including German Chancellor Olaf Scholz, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky, King Charles III of the United Kingdom, French President Emmanuel Macron and Polish President Andrzej Duda, along with representatives from approximately 60 countries and international organizations.





22 Nigerian soldiers killed by suspected terrorists: military

Abuja, Jan 31 (IANS): At least 22 Nigerian soldiers have been killed and several others wounded by suspected terrorists in a remote town in the country's northeastern state of Borno, the military said on Friday.

Edward Buba, spokesperson for the military, confirmed the casualties in a statement obtained Monday by Xinhua in Abuja, the Nigerian capital, without revealing where and when the attack took place.

He said the suspected terrorists

planned an ambush and deployed improvised explosive devices, such as person-borne explosive devices and vehicle-borne explosive devices, to ward off advancing ground troops during an antiterror raid.

The recent attack on troops followed the thwarting of several terrorist attempts on military bases in Borno, with the military "shooting down the amateur drones used by the terrorists" in some of the attacks, Buba said, recalling that at least 70 suspected terrorists,

including a brigade commander and a special forces commander for an armed group in the northeast region, had been killed earlier. On Sunday, local media outlets reported that another highranking commander was also among those killed during the attack on an army base in Borno, Xinhua news agency reported. Israel reports 439 traffic fatalities in 2024

Tel Aviv, Jan 31 (IANS): Israel recorded 439 traffic fatalities in 2024, a 21.6 per cent rise compared to the 361 deaths registered in 2023, according to a statement issued by the Israel Bureau of Statistics on Friday. The bureau noted that

the number of fatalities last year was the highest since 2006, when 439 people were killed in traffic accidents in Israel, Xinhua news agency reported. The number of fatal accidents in the country rose by 19.8 per cent year-on-year, from 338 in 2023 to 405 in 2024. The

main causes of traffic accidents resulting in fatalities or serious injuries in 2024 were failure to yield to pedestrians, ignoring traffic lights, lane crossing, and excessive speed, Israel's National Road Safety Authority revealed in a press release in early January.

Nicosia, Jan 31 (IANS): Israeli flights scheduled to land at Paphos airport in western Cyprus have been redirected to Larnaca airport on the island's southern coast, following a directive from Israeli authorities, according to a Cypriot official on Friday. The change in destination, which will last several days, comes after the Israeli government cited "various security reasons" for the decision. Victor Papadopoulos, Director of the Cyprus President's press office, confirmed the alteration in flight routes, stating, "We were informed that the Israelis decided to operate their flights to and from Larnaca airport instead of Paphos." However, Papadopoulos refrained from providing further details on the reasons behind the move.

Israeli media first reported the change late on Sunday night, mentioning security concerns as the primary factor. According to Cyprus' state-run Cyprus News Agency, the decision was made by Israel's Shin Bet domestic security agency. The directive is expected to remain in place until further notice.

Overnight temperature drops to minus 44.4 degrees celsius in western Mongolia

Temperatures plunged to minus 44.4 degrees celsius in Otgon soum, an administrative subdivision of Zavkhan province in western Mongolia, during the overnight hours from Saturday to Sunday, the country's National Agency for Meteorology and Environmental Monitoring said Monday. This is the coldest temperature recorded in Mongolia so far this winter, the weather monitoring agency in a statement. The agency has forecasted that most parts of Mongolia will experience colder temperatures than the long-term average throughout the winter.

Pakistan: Six killed, dozens injured as fire engulfs residential colony in Multan

Islamabad, Jan 31 (IANS): Six people were killed and over 31 others injured when fire engulfed a resident colony in Pakistan's eastern Punjab province in the early hours of Friday, officials said.

The incident happened at about 12:25 am local time (GMT 1925 Friday) in the Multan district where a massive explosion caused by a Liquefied Petroleum Gas container leakage rocked the colony, sources from the district's police revealed. The gas leakage triggered the fire, and the force of the blast scattered debris over a wide area, severely impacting the densely populated colony.

The bench noted that the illegal assets in question were no longer in the possession of the accused. It emphasized that the ED's investigation should not interfere with the proceedings of the court, which has reserved its

judgment in the MUDA case. The court further questioned the ED's urgency, stating: "What is the emergency to probe the matter at this juncture? The case has been reserved for judgment. Why should the investigation by the ED proceed now?" ASG Kamat explained that the ED had only requested the accused to appear and produce documents, and that this would not interfere with the court's proceedings.



Tension prevails along India-Bangladesh border after clash between farmers

Agartala, Jan 31 (IANS): Tension prevailed along the India-Bangladesh border in Tripura's Unakoti district on Friday after a clash between the farmers of two villages on the border of the countries, officials said.

The BSF and police officials separately said the villagers of India and Bangladesh clashed among themselves over the issue of farming in cropland in the border village of Hirachhara in Kailashahar Sub-division on Sunday evening. According to the officials, two Indian farmers and a Bangladeshi cultivator were injured in the clash before the BSF troops intervened in the conflict. Local people said that Indian farmers -- Karim Ali (28) and Zamir Ali (34), both brothers, were severely assaulted with sharp weapons and iron rods by a group of 10-12 Bangladesh nationals. The attack left them critically injured, with Karim sustaining deep wounds on his left hand and back while Zamir suffered head injuries.

Both are currently undergoing

medical treatment at the Unakoti District Hospital, where doctors have indicated that Karim's lefthand finger may need an ampu-

The incident occurred when the two brothers, who cultivate betel leaves and paddy on their land near the zero line of the border, had gone for farming activities on Sunday and found significant damage to their crops. They informed the matter to the Border Security Force (BSF) personnel posted in the area.

Will develop 10 ultra-modern industrial towns: Haryana CM

Chandigarh, Jan 31 (IANS): Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini on Friday laid a roadmap for the all-round development of the state to mark the completion of 100 days of the BJP government. Samsung Electronics said on Friday its fourth-quarter net income rose more than 20 per cent from a year earlier despite the waning global demand for memory chips, beating market expectations.

Its net income totalled 7.75 trillion won (\$5.4 billion) for the October-December period, up 22.2 per cent from 6.34 trillion won a year earlier, the company said in a regulatory filing. Operating profit soared 129.9 per cent on-year to 6.49 trillion won, while sales rose 11.8 per cent to 75.78 trillion won.

Seoul, Jan 31 (IANS): The earnings exceeded market expectations. The average estimate of net profit by analysts stood at 5.69 trillion won, according to a survey by Yonhap Infomax, the financial data firm of Yonhap News Agency. However, its operating profit missed the market's estimate by 15.7 per cent due to sluggish sales of traditional memory chips for personal computers and IT devices, as well as lowerthan-expected performance of artificial intelligence (AI) products, such as high bandwidth memory (HBM).

Indian automotive sector likely to see 70 pc workforce expansion in H2 FY25

Bengaluru, Jan 31 (IANS): The Indian automotive sector, which contributes approximately 7 per cent to the country's GDP, is likely to see 70 per cent workforce expansion in the second half of FY25, a report showed on

The automotive sector is experiencing a net em ployment change of 8.5 per cent, with hiring momentum fuelled by growing consumer interest in electric vehicles (EVs), premium models, and high-tech, connected automobiles, said the report by TeamLease Services, India's premier staffing solutions company.



L&T's Q3 profit dips despite 53 pc surge in orders, rising costs squeeze margins

Mumbai, Jan 31 (IANS): Larsen & Toubro (L&T) reported over 1 per cent decline in net profit for the third quarter (Q3) of the financial year 2024-25 at Rs 3,358.84 crore, excluding non-controlling interests, from Rs 3,395.29 crore reported in the previous quarter (Q2 FY25). L&T's revenue rose by 17 per cent at Rs 64,668 crore in Q3FY25, up from Rs 55,128 crore in Q3FY24, according to its stock exchange filing. However, despite this growth, the company fell short of market expectations. Analysts attributed the decline to a contraction in L& T's operating margins. The company's EBITDA margin declined by 70 basis points to 9.7 per cent in Q3FY25 from 10.4 per cent a year ago.

This decline was primarily due to a sharp rise in



costs. The cost of raw materials and components surged by 50 per cent, while expenses for construction materials went up by 16 per cent. L&T's infrastructure projects segment had been facing margin pressure for several quarters. The company had secured infrastructure contracts at highly competitive prices following the COVID-19 pandemic and the geopolitical crisis caused by the Russia-Ukraine conflict in 2022-23.



India's 2-wheeler market set to hit new peak next year with 8-10 pc growth

New Delhi, Jan 31 (IANS): Following an estimated 12-14 per cent surge this fiscal, the India's two-wheeler industry is set to grow by another 8-10 per cent in the upcoming year, a report said on Friday.

The Crisil Ratings report added that it will surpass the previous record of over 24 million units seen in 2019 as the sales volume is expected to reach a new peak. This growth is driven mainly by four key factors -- strong rural demand, rising urban interest in premium motorcycles, better export opportunities, and a diverse range of models, including electric two-wheelers (e2Ws), according to the report.

The revenue of two-wheeler manufacturers is expected to increase by 10-12 per cent next fiscal, compared to around 16 per cent this year, the report added.

This growth will be fuelled by higher sales volumes and a shift towards premium models, which generate better profit margins. Moreover, the operating margin of original equipment manufacturers (OEMs) is projected to reach a decade-high level of around 15 per cent this fiscal and remain steady next year.

This is an improvement from the average of 14 per cent in the past three years. Higher exports and the premiumisation trend will further boost profitability.

Domestic sales make up nearly 85 per cent of the two-wheeler market, while exports account for the rest. "Higher rural incomes and increasing interest in premium internal combustion engine (ICE) vehicles and electric two-wheelers will drive this growth," said Anuj Sethi, Senior Director at Crisil Ratings.

Apple now has installed base of 2.35 billion active devices globally

New Delhi, Jan 31 (IANS): The installed base of Apple devices has reached an all-time high across all products and geographic segments and is now over 2.35 billion active devices. According to Apple CEO Tim Cook, the company achieved an all-time revenue record in Services for the period ending December 31, 2024.

"In the past year, we've seen nearly \$100 billion in revenue from our services business. I'm also pleased to announce that we reached a new record for our install base with over 2.35 billion active devices. In October, we released the first set of Apple Intelligence features in US," Cook told analysts. The December quarter revenue stood at \$124.3 billion, up 4 per cent year over year. Services revenue reached an all-time record of \$26.3 billion in the December quarter, up 14 per cent year over year. The company grew in every geographic segment.



Cipla's Q3 net profit rises 49 pc to Rs 1,575 crore, revenue up 7 pc

Pharmaceutical major Cipla on Friday reported a 49 per cent year-on-year (YoY) increase in its consolidated net profit for the December quarter (Q3 FY25) at Rs 1,574.6 crore, from Rs 1,068.5 crore in the same quarter last year (Q2 FY25). The company's revenue from operations grew by 7 per cent YoY to Rs 7,073 crore, compared to Rs 6,604 crore in Q3 FY24, according to its exchange filing. However, it remained nearly flat on a quarter-on-quarter (QoQ) basis, with revenue

Tata Motors' Q3 profit drops 22 pc, EV sales up 19 pc

Mumbai, Jan 31 (IANS): Revenue from operations rose by Tata Motors on Friday reported a 22 per cent decline in its net profit for the third quarter (Q3) of FY25 at Rs 5,451 crore, down from Rs 7,025 crore in the same period last fiscal.

The drop in earnings was primarily due to higher discounts offered to boost sales and weaker margins, despite a slight improvement in overall revenue.

2.7 per cent year-on-year to Rs 1,13,575 crore, supported by a modest increase in sales, according to its filing.

However, the company's earnings before interest, tax, depreciation, and amortization (EBITDA) margins declined by 60 basis points to 13.7 per cent.

Earnings before interest and tax (EBIT) stood at Rs 10,000 crore which is a slight improvement of 60 basis points compared to the previous year.

Automotive free cash flow stood at Rs 4,700 crore, supported by improved sales, while finance costs shrank by Rs 760 crore to Rs 1,725 crore. Jaguar Land Rover (JLR), Tata Motors' luxury vehicle subsidiary, reported record quarterly revenue of 7.5 billion pounds up by 1.5 per cent increase from last year. The segment's EBIT margin stood at 9 per cent.



Madras HC expresses concerns about security lapses within its premises

Chennai, Jan 31 (IANS): The Madras High Court has voiced serious concerns about security lapses within its premises after the Additional Advocate General (AAG), P. Kumaresan, presented a status report on allegations that country-made bombs were brought into the court and handed to accused individuals involved in the murder of State Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) President, K. Armstrong. The AAG submitted CCTV footage showing individuals carrying bombs concealed in lunch bags. Six advocates impli-

cated in the incident have been suspended by the Bar Council. A division bench comprising Justices S.M. Subramaniam and N. Jothiraman was hearing a batch of petitions seeking to quash the invocation of the Goonda Act against the accused in Armstrong's murder case. During the proceedings, the bench expressed concern over the potential consequences of the incident. Justice Subramaniam remarked, "What if the bombs had exploded in the court? How many lives would we have lost? What if the blast damaged the statue of

B.R. Ambedkar?" The court invited opinions from stakeholders, including advocate associations, the police, and the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF), to strengthen security measures on the court campus. It also advised advocates to cooperate security checks, emphasising the need for sensitivity and vigilance. The counsel for the petitioners, however, objected to the allegations, arguing that the investigation had not provided concrete evidence to substantiate the claims.

DJB refutes Kejriwal's 'poison in water' allegation; explains seasonal ammonia fluctuations in Yamuna

New Delhi, Jan 31 (IANS): The Delhi Jal Board (DJB) has responded to claims made by former Delhi Chief Minister and convenor of the Aam Aadmi Party, Arvind Kejriwal who accused the Haryana government of releasing "poison" into the raw water flowing into the national capital. He also referred to the issue as a case of "water terrorism" in a letter to the Election Commission of India (ECI).

DJB has categorically dismissed these allegations, stating, "These statements are factually incorrect, without any basis and misleading." DJB stated that it regularly monitors the quality of incoming water and adjusts the supplies based on various water quality parameters. According to

the Board, ammonia levels in the Yamuna River naturally rise during the winter season, particularly between October and February. The DJB clarified that its Water Treatment Plants are designed to treat ammonia levels up to 1 ppm (parts per million), and they can also manage ammonia concentrations between 2 and 2.5 ppm through a process of dilution using water from the Carrier Line Channel (CLC) and Delhi Sub Branch (DSB). The rise in ammonia levels, according to the DJB, is primarily caused by the mixing of untreated sewage or industrial waste upstream of the Wazirabad Barrage, compounded by lower water flow during the winter months, especially after the monsoon season.

Rajasthan Police arrest four, seize five country-made pistols

Bharatpur, Jan 31 (IANS): Intensifying their efforts against the illegal arms trade, Rajasthan Police on Friday seized five country-made pistols and five live cartridges while arresting four more individuals and detained a minor. This brings the total arrests in the case to eight, with a cumulative recovery of eight pistols, and 45 cartridges. Superintendent of Police (SP) Mridul Kachhawa stated that the operation is part of an ongoing campaign against illegal weapons under his direction. The operation was carried out under the supervision of Additional Superintendent of Police (ASP) Satish Yadav and Circle Officer (CO) City Pankaj Yadav (IPS). Life sentence for Himachal IG, seven cops for custodial death in gangrape-murder case

Chandigarh, Jan 31 (IANS) : A CBI court here on Friday awarded life imprisonment to Himachal Pradesh Inspector General of Police Z.H. Zaidi and seven other police personnel for custodial death of an accused in the gangrapemurder of a schoolgirl in Shimla's Kotkhai in 2017 that triggered violent protests.

The other convicted police officials include then DSP Manoj Joshi, Sub-Inspector Rajinder Singh, Assistant Sub-Inspector Deep Chand Sharma, Head Constables Mohan Lal, Surat Singh and Rafee Mohammad and Constable Raneet Sateta.

Counsels for the convicts prayed for leniency on the basis of the age, family commitments and good service records of convicts. However,

the court acquitted former Superintendent of Police D.W. Negi-The court convicted them on January 18 and the quantum of the sentence was prounced on Monday. The Supreme Court in 2019 transferred the case from Shimla to Chandigarh on a plea filed by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) for expeditious disposal of the case. The girl had gone missing in Kotkhai and her body was found in a forest near Kotkhai town in Shimla district on July 6, 2017, two days after her disappearance. The crime had led to arson by a mob demanding justice for the girl. After the crime, police had claimed that the schoolgirl was offered a lift in a vehicle by one of the accused while she was returning home from school in Kotkhai town, 56 km from Shimla. On the way, the accused and his accomplices gang-raped



and murdered her in a nearby forest.

Her naked body with injury marks was found. Later, the Himachal Pradesh government agreed to recommend a CBI probe. After the CBI took over, nine police personnel, including Inspector General of Police Zaidi and former Shimla Superintendent of Police D.W. Negi, were arrested on the charge of custodial death of accused Suraj.

Los Angeles schools struggle to rebuild after devastating wildfires

California, Jan 31 (IANS): The devastating wildfires that began sweeping through Southern California on January 7 have left the region's education system reeling, with over a dozen schools severely damaged or destroyed.


As school officials begin the daunting task of rebuilding, they face an estimated cost of hundreds of millions of US dollars, with recovery expected to take years, reports Xinhua news agency.

At least 12 schools in Los Angeles County have suffered significant damage, with five campuses destroyed, according to CalMatters, a nonprofit news organisation focusing on local agendas in California. Los Angeles Unified School District, the nation's second-largest school system, lost two elementary schools in Pacific Palisades, while Palisades Charter High School was heavily damaged. In Pasadena and Altadena, three additional elementary schools were destroyed.

The financial toll is overwhelming. Rebuilding could cost hundreds of millions of dollars. "Rebuilding these schools could take years," said Debra Duardo, Los Angeles County Superintendent of Schools.

One source of relief is California's Proposition 2, a 10billion-dollar school construction bond passed in November to fund repairs and rebuild efforts, including damage from disasters like wildfires.

However, the fund is distributed on a first-come, first-served basis, and there is already a significant backlog of schools waiting for assistance. Priority will likely go to schools damaged by fires, raising concerns for districts with other urgent needs.





Iraq urges unified efforts to support regional stability

Baghdad, Jan 31 (IANS): Iraqi Prime Minister Mohammed Shia' al-Sudani called for unified efforts among regional countries to support stability in the Middle East. Al-Sudani made the remarks on Friday during a meeting with visiting Turkish Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan.

According to a statement by al-Sudani's media office, the two discussed bilateral relations and the latest developments in Syria, Gaza and Lebanon, emphasizing the importance of adhering to the ceasefire agreements.

Al-Sudani reiterated "Iraq's readi-

ness to coordinate with neighboring countries, especially Türkiye, regarding ongoing regional developments," it said. For his part, Fidan reaffirmed his country's desire to maintain close coordination with Iraq on regional developments, stressing Turkey's commitment to the strategic Development Road project and cooperation based on the memorandums of understanding signed between the two countries in areas such as energy, education, trade, banking, and other sectors, Xinhua news agency reported.



Singapore calls for proposals to pilot autonomous public buses

Singapore, Jan 31 (IANS): Singapore's Land Transport Authority (LTA) has invited industry players to submit proposals for a pilot programme to test autonomous public buses, the authority announced Friday.

The call for proposals, which closes by the second quarter of 2025, aims to kick-start a three-year trial of smaller autonomous buses on two selected routes beginning in mid-2026.

New Zealand relaxes visitor visa rules to allow tourists' 'workcation'

The New Zealand government is relaxing visitor visa rules to allow tourists to work remotely for their foreign employers while visiting New Zealand in the latest effort to boost tourism and economic growth.

The government is making the country more attractive to "digital nomads," people who work remotely, while travelling, such as IT specialists, which will boost New Zealand's attractiveness as a destination, Economic Growth Minister Nicola Willis said on Friday, as reported by Xinhua news agency.

Tourism is New Zealand's sec-

Wellington, Jan 31 (IANS): ond-largest export earner, generating revenue of almost 11 billion NZ dollars (6.26 billion US dollars) and creating nearly 200,000 jobs, Willis said.

> "The change will enable many visitors to extend their stays, which will lead to more money being spent in the country," said Immigration Minister Erica Stanford. Visitor visas will allow people to work remotely for a foreign employer from Monday while they are holidaying in New Zealand, she said, adding that anyone who intends to work remotely for more than 90 days should look at possible tax implications.

Tourism Minister Louise Upston



said many countries offer digital nomad visas, and New Zealand aims to be an attractive destination for people who want to "workcation" abroad, as ways of working become increasingly more digitised and flexible.

"Compared to other kinds of visitors, international remote workers have the potential to spend more time and money in New Zealand, including during the shoulder season," Upston said. However, visitors whose employment requires them to be in New Zealand, such as sales representatives of overseas companies, performers and people coming to work for New Zealand employers, must still obtain visas relevant to their circumstances, according to the government.

Duped and trafficked, 67 Indians rescued from cyber-scam centres in Laos

Vientiane, Jan 31 (IANS): The Embassy of India in Laos announced on Friday that it has successfully rescued 67 Indian youth who had been duped and trafficked into cyber-scam centres operating in the Golden Triangle Special Economic Zone (GTSEZ) in Bokeo Province of the Southeast Asian country.

These youths were forced to work there under intimidation and abuse by criminal syndicates operating in GTSEZ.

"Immediately upon receiving their requests for help, Embassy officials responded to all of them

promptly and extended all necessary assistance. A team of Embassy officials travelled to GTSEZ at once and worked closely with concerned Lao authorities to achieve required procedures and paperwork to enable them to leave GTSEZ and travel to the Embassy in Vientiane. Their transport from Bokeo to Vientiane was also facilitated. Arrangements for their accommodation and food have been made by the Embassy, as needed," stated the Embassy of India in Laos.

Prashant Agrawal, Ambassador of India to Laos, met with the rescued Indians, discussing the challenges faced by them while assuring full safety and Embassy's full support "as a matter of highest priority" for their safe return to India. He also advised them about further course of action, including the need for them to lodge complaints against the agents who had duped them.

The Embassy officials in Vientiane are currently working closely with concerned Laos authorities for completion of rescued Indian's exit formalities, following which all of them would be able to travel back home shortly.

Kailash Mansarovar Yatra, direct India-China flights to resume soon: MEA

Beijing, Jan 31 (IANS): India and China have decided to the Kailash Mansarovar Yatra in the summer of 2025, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) announced following Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri's meeting with Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi in Beijing, on Friday. The meeting, held under the Foreign Secretary-Vice Foreign Minister mechanism, reviewed the state of India-China bilateral relations comprehensively and agreed to take certain people-centric

steps to stabilize and rebuild ties, as agreed between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping during their meeting in Kazan in October. According to the MEA, the relevant mechanism will discuss further the modalities for Yatra as per the existing agreements.

Both sides also agreed, in principle, to resume direct air services between the two countries with the relevant technical authorities on the two sides to negotiate an updated framework for the purpose at an early date.

"They also agreed to hold an early



meeting of the India-China Expert Level Mechanism to discuss resumption of provision of hydrological data and other cooperation pertaining to trans-border rivers," read a statement issued by the MEA. With 2025 being the 75th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between India and China, it was decided by

both sides to "redouble" public diplomacy efforts to create better awareness about each other and restore mutual trust and confidence among the public. Taking stock of the extant mechanisms for functional exchanges, both sides will also conduct a number of commemorative activities to mark the anniversary. "It was agreed to resume these dialogues step by step and to utilise them to address each other's priority areas of interest and concern.



Japanese PM Ishiba's cabinet approval at 35.7 per cent

Tokyo, Jan 31 (IANS): Japanese Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba's Cabinet approval rating remains at 35.7 per cent, slightly down from 36.5 per cent last month, while disapproval rose to 49.2 per cent, according to a Kyodo News survey.

Economic concerns dominated, with 84.3 per cent of respondents expressing worry over the potential impact of US President Donald Trump's planned tariffs on Japan's economy, particularly its auto industry.



Africa loses 18 billion USD annually due to conflict: African Union

Nairobi, Jan 31 (IANS): Kenyan President William Ruto, who is also the champion of the African Union (AU) institutional reforms, said on Friday that conflict continues to deny Africa of its potential, costing the continent an estimated 18 billion US dollars annually and displacing millions of people. Ruto said Africa currently hosts 35 million internally displaced persons, 8.9 million refugees, 1.1 million asylum seekers, and one million stateless persons. "Between April and June 2024 alone, a total of 1,000 terrorism incidents were recorded across Africa, resulting in 4,818 deaths," he said during the high-level Extended Bureau Retreat on AU Institutional Reforms held in the Kenyan capital of Nairobi. The day-long event brought together presidents from Guinea-Bissau, Ethiopia, Ghana, and the Comoros, as well as Moussa Faki, Chairperson of the AU Commission, to accelerate reforms of the 55-member continental organisation.

Ruto noted that the AU security architecture in its current configuration is incapable of addressing the continent's complex dynamics and challenges, and there is an urgent need for immediate revitalization of the peace and security architecture.

South Korea: Preliminary report of Jeju Air crash shows Black Box stopped recording 2 km before runway

Korean authorities investigating the tragic Jeju Air crash last month released a preliminary accident report on Friday, revealing that the aircraft's Black Box stopped recording approximately 2 kms before the plane approached the runway.

It is the first report as part of the ongoing investigation into the deadly crash at Muan International Airport on December 29, which claimed the lives of 179 of the 181 people aboard the Boeing 737-800. Only two people survived. The preliminary findings will

The preliminary findings will be submitted to the International Civil Aviation

Seoul, Jan 31 (IANS): South Korean authorities investigating the tragic Jeju Air crash last month released a preliminary accident report on Frigiety.

The ICAO, a United Nations agency, mandates that investigators produce a preliminary report within 30 days of an aviation accident. It also encourages the release of a final report within 12 months.

The investigation committee under the transport ministry disclosed the approximate location where the Black Box, comprising the Flight Data Recorder (FDR) and Cockpit Voice Recorder (CVR), stopped functioning.

According to the report, the Black Box stopped recording at 8:58:50



a.m. on December 29, four minutes and seven seconds before the aircraft struck a localiser near the runway after it had hit a flock of birds. The ministry noted it would take several months to analyze the FDR and the CVR for further verification, Yonhap news agency reported. The report further stated that the exact timing of the bird strike, the number of birds involved and whether other bird species were present have yet to be determined.

The ministry briefed bereaved families on the preliminary findings during a meeting on Saturday. Earlier on January 25, Yonhap

news agency reported that the ill-fated Jeju Air plane involved in last month's deadly crash had received a warning from Air Traffic Control about bird activity just one minute before its Black Box recording stopped, the transport ministry said. The ministry had revealed the preliminary findings to the bereaved families following its probe into the fatal crash of the low-cost carrier plane from Bangkok.

The government had planned to release the preliminary report by Monday, the ministry said.

The investigation committee under the ministry had stated that surveillance footage from the time of the accident at Muan International Airport had confirmed that the plane had attempted a go-around when it had hit a flock of birds.

PM Vishwakarma scheme shines at Maha Kumbh; empowering artisans with skills, support



New Delhi, Jan 31 (IANS): A special centre for the 'PM Vishwakarma Scheme' has been set up at the ongoing Maha Kumbh in Prayagraj, where people are provided with information regarding the scheme and given assistance to avail its benefits.

New York, Jan 31 (IANS): As the US has intensified its campaign of rounding up illegal migrants and deporting them on military planes, it overcame opposition from Colombia with threats of tariffs in a preview of how President Donald Trump will enforce his campaign promise. After Colombia refused to let two aircraft carrying its nationals apprehended in the US as illegal migrants land, Trump announced on Truth Social on Sunday afternoon a 25 per cent tariff on imports from that country, which, he threatened, would double in a week. However, by Sunday night, Colombia's resistance crumbled, and the White House said it had agreed to "unrestricted acceptance of all illegal aliens from Colombia" including those coming on military planes.

In a show of force on Sunday, federal agents fanned out across the US rounding up criminal illegal migrants. Trump had promised mass deporations in his Day 1 agenda.



Heavy snow pounds South Korea, alert issued

Seoul, Jan 31 (IANS): Heavy snow and rain affected many parts of South Korea on Friday during the extended Lunar New Year holiday, prompting authorities to raise the weather alert and brace for possible disruptions.

This year's Lunar New Year holiday, known as Seol, was extended to six days, lasting until Thursday, after the government designated Monday as a temporary national holiday.

Greece: Thousands protest in Athens over 2023 train tragedy

Athens, Jan 31 (IANS): Roughly 30,000 people gathered outside the Greek parliament on Friday, demanding justice for the 2023 train collision in Tempi, central Greece, which claimed 57 lives. The demonstration, organised by an association of victims' families, was supported by opposition parties and labour unions, reports Xinhua news agency.

The families accused the government of mishandling the investigation, alleging a "coverup" of key details. There were claims that victims died from asphyxiation caused by an explosion rather than injuries from the collision, suggesting the explosion may have been triggered by flammable materials allegedly carried illegally on the freight train involved in the accident.

Protesters held banners declaring, "It was not



an accident, but a crime," and painted the victims' names in red on the pavement near the parliament. The slogan "I have no oxygen," reportedly spoken by a victim during the incident, echoed at rallies held in Athens. Similar protests were reported in around 100

Greek cities and a dozen other European locations. The protest turned violent when groups of hooded youths threw rocks and petrol bombs at police, prompting officers to respond with tear gas.

Afghanistan kicks off polio vaccination campaign in 16 provinces

Kabul, Jan 31 (IANS): Afghanistan initiated its first vaccination campaign in 2025, targetting over six million children under the age of five from poliovirus, the Ministry of Public Health reported.

Scheduled from Monday through Wednesday, the campaign will deliver anti-polio drops to children in 16 out of the country's 34 provinces, the state-run National Radio and Television quoted the ministry as reporting.

In his message, Noor Jalal Jalali, acting minister of public health, urged tribal elders, religious scholars and parents to support polio workers. Social support plays an essential role in preventing polio, he

Afghanistan said. neighbouring Pakistan are countries where polio cases are reported every year, Xinhua news agency reported. According to the World Health Organization, Poliomyelitis, commonly known as polio, is a highly contagious viral illness that predominantly impacts children under the age of five. The transmission of the virus occurs primarily through direct personto-person contact, mainly via the faecal-oral route, although it can also spread through contaminated food or water. Once ingested, the virus multiplies in the intestines and has the potential to invade the nervous system, leading to paraly-

In 1988, the World Health Assembly passed a resolution aimed at

the global eradication of polio, which initiated the Global Polio Eradication Initiative. This initiative is led by national governments in collaboration with organisations such as the WHO, Rotary International, the US Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), UNICEF, and later supported by the Bill & amp; Melinda Gates Foundation and Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance. Since the launch of this initiative, the incidence of wild poliovirus has plummeted by over 99 per cent, decreasing from an estimated 350,000 cases across more than 125 endemic nations in 1988 to just six reported cases in 2021





Immediate ceasefire urged in Congo as rebels claim control of strategic city

Goma, Jan 31 (IANS): The ordered government forces to dis-March 23 Movement (M23), a rebel group fighting against the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) army, said on Friday that it has taken control of Goma, the capital of North Kivu Province and the largest city in eastern DRC.

In a statement released early on Monday, the M23 announced the "liberation of the city has been completed" and that "the situation is under control" following a 48-hour ultimatum issued to Congolese troops. On Saturday, the group demanded the surrender of the DRC armed forces and their allies. The M23 held Goma for 10 days in 2012 before retreating under international pressure. By Sunday night, the rebels

arm. According to local sources, several Congolese soldiers reportedly handed over their weapons to UN peacekeepers stationed in Goma.

The DRC government has not yet commented on the situation in Goma but announced that a highlevel security meeting was held Sunday night, chaired by President Felix Tshisekedi.

At least 10 people were killed and about 4,400 inmates escaped from Munzenze Prison in Goma amid the ongoing conflict, according to local media reports. Radio Okapi, a UN-supported outlet, reported that prisoners set part of the facility on fire during clashes between the DRC army and M23 rebels. Gunfire has been heard across


Goma since Sunday evening, and fighting intensified Monday morning in various parts of the city, including areas near the Rwandan border. UN sources said that the border with Rwanda was closed Monday morning, and panic has gripped Goma residents fleeing to Gisenyi, a Rwandan border city. During a Sunday press conference at the United Nations headquarters in New York, DRC Foreign Minister Therese Kayikwamba Wagner described the M23's actions as "an onslaught on Goma." The humanitarian crisis in eastern DRC continues to worsen. The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees said Friday that more than 400,000 people have been displaced since January 2025.

Sectarian violence to staggering economy: Syria's new administration faces several major challenges

Since the sudden downfall of Bashar al-Assad's government 50 days ago, Syria's transitional administration has been grappling with multiple challenges -- from surging violence to monitor Syrian Observatory for Human Rights (SOHR) reported a worrisome rise in assassination and reprisal crimes since the start of 2025. Millions remain displaced while skyrocketing inflation deals a crippling blow to people's living standards. ESCWA outlined three scenarios for Syria's future. A "stabilized transition" promises

inclusive governance, robust reconstruction and comprehensive support from the international community. The alternative scenarios -- "prolonged instability" or "war and fragmentation" -- paint a far grimmer picture, involving sustained poverty, escalating humanitarian crisis and the possibility of renewed violence.

The new leadership has vowed to rebuild schools, hospitals and energy facilities. However, whether it can secure the necessary investments and negotiate sanctions relief remains uncertain, partly due to Western sanctions originally aimed at Assad.



Thousands of displaced Palestinians return to Gaza

Gaza, Jan 31 (IANS): Tens of thousands of Palestinians began returning to their homes in Gaza City and the northern parts of the coastal enclave on Friday after 15 months of forced displacement. The return follows an announcement by Qatar on Sunday evening that Hamas and Israel had reached an agreement to release Israeli hostage Arbel Yehud and two others by Friday.

Sweden seizes ship suspected of damaging Baltic undersea cable



Al-Burhan, also the commander of the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF), made the remarks while visiting the SAF's General Command

Khartoum, Jan 31 (IANS): headquarters in capital Khartoum, which had recently been freed from a 21-month siege imposed by the RSF, according to a sovereign council statement, Xinhua news agency said. "The battle is coming to its end and the rebellion will be eradicated. Our pledge to the Sudanese people is that we will fight these criminals until we defeat them," Al-Burhan told a crowd of soldiers. "The armed forces are capable and resilient. They will not be defeated, and

their history speaks for itself," he said. The General Command, located in the heart of Khartoum, comprises five main buildings, including the Army Headquarters, Navy Command, Air Force Headquarters.



Aussie allrounder Marsh ruled out of Champions Trophy with lower back injury

Melbourne, Jan 31 (IANS) Australian allrounder Mitchell Marsh has been ruled out of the ICC Champions Trophy in Pakistan and the UAE, starting from February 19, due to ongoing lower "back pain and dysfunction".

"The National Selection Panel and Australian men's medical team ruled Marsh out of the tournament with the injury which has not responded sufficiently to rehabilitation," Cricket Australia said on Friday. His lower back pain flared in recent weeks leading the NSP to make the longer term decision for Marsh to complete a more extended period of rehabilitation.

CA said Marsh will now undergo a period of further rest and rehabilitation as part of his return to play plan. The NSP will meet to decide on a replacement for Marsh in due course.

Marsh, who lost his place in Australia's Test line-up before the final match of the Border-Gavaskar Trophy campaign against India, has not played since a solitary BBL appearance for Perth Scorchers earlier this month.

The deadline for the final squads for the ICC Men's Champion's Trophy is prior to February 12.
