STF. The order states: "The new STF will have three companies and they will be established in Udupi, Shivamogga and Mangaluru districts. The functions and responsibilities of this force include establishing an intelligence unit with a technical cell to monitor and collect information from the media, social



media, and intelligence sources regarding hate speech, provocative incidents.

"To create an alert system for

potential communal violence through surveillance and human intelligence; to undertake confidence-building measures through effective outreach and influence; to implement measures to identify and monitor radicalisation."

The IGP of the zone will take the necessary steps to deploy special task force officers/personnel during instances of communal riots, it says.

'No action taken despite filing complaint': K'taka Legislative Council LoP on his 'detention'

Bengaluru, June 1 (IANS): Leader of the Opposition in the Karnataka Legislative Council, Chalavadi Narayanaswamy, said on Thursday that no action has been taken despite filing complaints regarding his "detention" and attempt to assault him in Chittapur. He alleged that he registered the complaint with the Chief Minister, the Home Minister, the Chief Secretary, and the Director General and Inspector General of Police. "I was confined for five hours in Chittapur. Our party workers were blocked from reaching me. Ink was thrown on my car. Stones were stockpiled. Preparations were made for pelting eggs and stones. I called and spoke to the Home Minister and the ADGP directly from the location. I spoke to the SP nearly 10 times," he added.

He added that the Additional SP was with him for five hours, however, no action was taken against those who abused him.

"After five hours, I was forced out of Chittapur. I went to Yadgir and had to cancel all programmes and returned to Bengaluru by train that very night," he



alleged. He claimed that Ambaraiah Ashtagi, a BJP leader who came to see him in Chittapur, was also assaulted. "His clothes were torn and thrown away. A complaint was filed against him, and he was detained at the Tehsildar's office. That is why we referred to this as the 'Republic of Kalaburagi'," he said.

Narayanaswamy recalled that when Chief Minister Siddaramaiah was the Leader of the Opposition, he had visited Kodagu.

PMK founder Ramadoss blames son Anbumani for party's decline

Chennai, June 1 (IANS): Pattali Makkal Katchi founder (PMK) Ramadoss on Sunday publicly expressed regret over elevating his son Anbumani Ramadoss to national prominence, accusing him of damaging the party's growth and forcing an alliance with the BJP during the 2024 Lok Sabha elections.

At a press conference held at his Thailapuram residence near Puducherry, Ramadoss said, "It was my mistake that I made Anbumani a Union Cabinet Minister at the age of 35 [in 2004]." The senior leader, who recently reclaimed the PMK president's post from Anbumani, launched a blistering attack on his son, accusing him of "functioning in a no-holdsbarred manner" that weakened the party's foundation.

New Delhi, June 1 (IANS): With The observation assumes importhe strong emerging fiscal position in 2025-26, the government is likely to have some additional headroom to meet unforeseen expenditure on account of defence, according to a Bank of Baroda report released on Sunday.

tance in the backdrop of the tensions with Pakistan following the Pahalgam terror attack and Operation Sindoor.

In its outlook for FY26, the report points out that the government has budgeted a fiscal deficit of 4.4 per cent of GDP, assuming 10.1 per cent growth in nominal GDP.

"We expect this growth to be around 11 per cent, as we believe real GDP will range between 6.4-6.6 per cent this year," the report states.

Social activist joins Congress

Kolkata, June 1 (IANS): Pirzada Amin, the general secretary of Basirhat Allama Ruhul Amin R Foundation, a non-government organisation operating from Basirhat in North 24 Parganas district of West Bengal, on Saturday, joined Congress.

In the recent past, he had been associated with the movements against the newly promulgated Waqf (Amendment) Act.

According to a statement issued by Congress, Amis was inducted into the party by the All India Congress Committee general secretary (West Bengal in-charge) Ghulam Ahmed Mir, the chairman of the AICC's media and publicity department, Pawan Khera, the state Congress president Subhankar Sarkar and the state president of Mahila Congress, Subrata Dutta at the AICC office in New Delhi.

In the statement, Amin had been described as a social activist. According to Khera, Amin belonged to a renowned family of West Bengal, which commands a lot of influence in Odisha and Tripura besides West Bengal

Khera also said that Amin's family played an



important role in the Muslim renaissance and addressed injustices within the community. "His family also contributed significantly to promoting education in society.

BJP keen to form govt in Manipur, says state unit chief after meeting MLAs

Imphal, June 1 (IANS): Manipur state BJP President Adhikarimayum Sharda Devi after holding a meeting with some MLAs on Saturday said that her party wants to form a "popular" government in the state.

Sharda Devi said that all BJP legislators are united and discussions were held on Saturday for the formation of the government at the earliest.

"The government should focus on development and bring peace and normalcy to the state," she told the media after the meeting.

Party sources said that 13 BJP MLAs attended the meeting, which was held at the party's state headquarters in the capital. BJP legislator Kh Ibomcha said

the formation of a government depends on the central leaders.





Simulated emergency exercise conducted at Kolkata Airport

Kolkata, June 1 (IANS): A hot fire drill, technically known as simulated emergency exercise, was conducted at the Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose International Airport in Kolkata on Sunday, according to a statement issued by the Corporate Communications Department of the airport.

According to the statement, the drill was a part of the airport's monthly emergency preparedness routine and on Thursday it started at 3:48 p.m. under the direction of Airport Director P.R. Beuria.

"A hot fire drill is a full-scale emergency simulation where multiple agencies perform their designated roles as they would in a real-life aircraft emergency.

Gurjar quota leader Vijay Bainsla warns of protest against Rajasthan govt, announces mahapanchayat on June 8

Jaipur, June 1 (IANS): Gurjar Reservation Struggle Committee President Vijay Bainsla, on Sunday, issued a stern warning to the Rajasthan government, saying that a decisive Mahapanchayat will be held in Pilupura (Bharatpur) on June 8, where future actions will be determined.

Speaking at a Shraddhanjali Sabha (tribute meeting) in Pipalkheda at Mahuwa area of Dausa, Bainsla accused the state government of failing to honour its commitments to the Gurjar community. He asserted, "We will not return home until our demands are met. The government has done nothing in the past 17 months."

In a poster released ahead of the Mahapanchayat, the Gurjar Reservation Committee outlined a series of long-pending demands, including revision of the roster system.

The current system allegedly fails to provide full reservation benefits. The committee demands implementation at the state level to ensure fair representation, he added.

Another demand is inclusion of five per cent reservation in the Ninth Schedule for the Most Back-



ward Classes (MBC). The state government should get cabinet approval and send a recommendation to the Central government for this constitutional protection, Bainsla said.

Withdrawal of cases from previous agitations as well as implementation of Devnarayan Yojana were other demands Bainsla spoke about. Devnarayan scheme has been inactive for 17 months, with no scooty distribution or scholarships. The committee demands monthly review meetings to resume. The pending job appointments reserved under the MBC quota over the past six years have not been given.

The state had assured the Jodhpur High Court that MBC reservation

would apply across general, OBC, and finally MBC categories, but it has not been implemented, he said.

He also spoke on backlog in Rajasthan Judicial Services. The MBC backlog has not been filled.

The demand is to include these vacancies from 2022 onwards, he said.

Bainsla added that the families of those who lost their lives during the reservation agitation should be given jobs and appropriate compensation. All agreements made earlier with the government must be respected and pending recruitments must be completed, he said.




K'taka govt replaces Mangaluru Commissioner & SP amid communal strife

Bengaluru, June 1 (IANS): Following a series of incidents involving mob lynching, revenge murders, and multiple stabbings in the Mangaluru region, the Karnataka government has replaced the Police Commissioner of Mangaluru City and the Superintendent of Police (SP) of Mangaluru district on Sunday.

A new SP has also been appointed for the neighbouring Udupi district.

According to the Chief Minister's Office (CMO), the government has taken strict action by transferring senior police officers from the coastal districts in response to the growing unrest. The move comes after several minority community office bearers in Mangaluru district announced their mass resignation from the Congress party, citing police inaction in recent violent incidents, including multiple stabbings and the murder of Abdul Raheem.



Maharaja Chhatrasal's biography in school curricula: CM

The biography of 17th-century Hindu warrior Maharaja Chhatrasal will be included in school curricula to educate students about his bravery and legacy, Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav announced on Sunday. The Chief Minister made this announcement while addressing a public ceremony on the occasion of Maharaja Chhatrasal Jayanti Panna district, in Bundelkhand region of Madhya Pradesh. Yadav said that the state government will also celebrate Chhatrasal Jayanti officially.

MP: Three of a family killed, two injured in lightning incident

Bhopal, June 1 (IANS): Three members of a family, including an eight-year-old child, lost their lives in Bara village under the Semariya police station area of Rewa district in Madhya Pradesh after being struck by lightning.

The deceased have been identified as Ashish Vasudeva, aged thirty-two, his wife Jyoti Vasudeva, twenty-six, and their son Kishan Vasudeva, aged eight.

The tragic incident occurred when the three were standing under a mango tree near their field. Lightning struck them, and they died instantly.

Two other family members, Naina Vasudeva, aged two, and Premlal Vasudeva, aged fifty-five, sustained injuries in the accident.

Reports suggested that Premlal's wife was also injured, but police denied this claim. The injured individuals were initially taken to the Primary Health Centre in Semariya. However, due to their critical condition, they were later referred to Sanjay Gandhi Medical College in Rewa for further treatment.

Centre imposes wheat stock limits on traders to keep prices in check

The Centre has imposed stock limits on wheat applicable to wholesale traders and retailers across the country to prevent hoarding and speculation that drives up inflation. "In order to manage the overall food security and to prevent hoarding and unscrupulous speculation, the Government of India has imposed stock limits on wheat applicable to wholesalers, retailers, big chain retailers, and processors in all states and Union Territories," the Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food & Dublic Distribution said on Thursday.

The Removal of Licensing Requirements, Stock Limits, and Movement Restrictions on Specified Foodstuffs (Amendment) Order, 2025, dated May 27, is applicable until March 31, 2026, for all states and Union Territories, a ministry statement said.

For wholesale traders, the limit of wheat stock is 3,000 metric tonnes (MT) and for retail traders, the stock limit has been fixed at 10 MT.

For bid chain retailers, the stock limit is up to 10 MT for each retail outlet, subject to a maximum quantity of (10 multiplied by the total no. of outlets) MT. This will be the maximum stock that can be held at all their retail outlets and depots put together.

In the case of processors, the stock limit for wheat has been fixed at 70 per cent of the monthly installed capacity multiplied by the remaining months of FY 2025-26.

All wheat stocking entities are required to declare updates of the stock position on every Friday on wheat stock portal (https://evegoils.nic.in/wsp/login which will be migrated in due course of time to https:// foodstock.dfpd.gov.in). Any entity which is found not to have registered on the portal or violates the stock limits will be subject to suitable punitive action under Sections 6 & Der Transport of the Essential Commodities Act, 1955, the order states.

In case the stocks held by these entities are higher than the prescribed limit, they will have to bring these to the prescribed stock limits within 15 days of the issue of the notification. Officials of the Central and state governments will be closely monitoring the enforcement of these stock limits to ensure that no artificial scarcity of wheat is created in the country, the statement said. Meanwhile, the Central government has procured 298.17 lakh metric tonnes LMT wheat, as on May 27, through state agencies/FCI, which is sufficient to meet requirements of the public distribution system and other market intervention schemes. The Department of Food and Public Distribution is maintaining a close watch over the stock position of wheat to control prices and ensure easy availability in the country, the statement added.



South Korea: All four Navy officers aboard patrol aircraft killed after crash in Pohang

ll four Navy officers aboard a maritime pa I Ltrol aircraft were killed after the plane crashed on a mountain in South Korea's southeastern city of Pohang on Thursday, the Navy said. The crash occurred at 1.49 p.m., and witnesses reported smoke rising from the mountain with sounds of explosions. "A P-3 maritime patrol aircraft that took off at 1.43 p.m. for landing and takeoff training from an air base in Pohang crashed at a nearby location at around 1.49 p.m., due to an unspecified reason," the Navy said. Four people were on board -- two commissioned officers and two non-commissioned officers. The Navy said it recovered the dead bodies of all four officers. The officers' identities have yet to be confirmed.

tions. He also said that the app will soon be available for free download on the Google Play Store. "This app is expected to be highly useful not only for the general public but also as a revolutionary tool for doctors and healthcare providers," he added. On this occasion, AIIMS Bhopal also organised a CPR and First Aid training session for media personnel.

During this one-day training, journalists received hands-on instruction in administering CPR. "An awareness campaign about this application should be carried out so that more and more people can know about it and get benefitted," Singh added

India didn't just win on battlefield, it nailed technology referendum during Operation Sindoor : US warfare expert

The rapid, multidomain military campaign Operation Sindoor not only dismantled crossborder terror networks but became a full-scale validation of India's defence transformation, a leading American defence analyst said on Thursday.

In his extensive analysis on Chinese Weapons — And India's Victory', top urban warfare expert John Spencer reckoned that Operation Sindoor wasn't just a military campaign but a technology demonstration, a market signal, and a strategic blueprint. "India showed the world what self-reliance in modern warfare looks like — and

proved that 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' works under fire," Spencer wrote. "Operation Sindoor pitted India's indigenously developed weapons systems against Chinese-supplied platforms fielded by Pakistan. And India didn't just win on the battlefield — it won the technology referendum.

What unfolded was not just retaliation, but the strategic debut of a titled 'India's Operation sovereign arsenal built under the Sindoor: A Battlefield Verdict twin doctrines of Make in India and Atmanirbhar Bharat," he added.

Spencer, currently the Chair of urban warfare studies at the Modern War Institute and a Co-Director of the Urban Warfare Project, stated that "Pakistan's proxy dependency" was no match to "India's sovereign power" during Operation Sindoor which demolished ter-



ror infrastructure deep inside hollowness Pakistan after the heinous April Islamabad's defence posture, 22 Pahalgam terror attack.

"India fought as a sovereign power — wielding precision tools it designed, built, and deployed with unmatched battlefield control. Pakistan fought as a proxy force, dependent on Chinese hardware that was built for export, not for excellence. When challenged, these systems failed — exposing the strategic Spencer wrote. Spencer also detailed how India's transformation into a modern defence power began in 2014, when Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the 'Make in India' initiative. The goal, he said, was clear: reduce dependence on foreign arms imports and build a world-class domestic defence industry.

Fundamentalist Yunus regime in Bangladesh cancels progressive diplomat's Kolkata posting

Dhaka, June 1 (IANS) : A Bangladeshi diplomat was recently forced to return to Dhaka instead of joining his new posting in Kolkata after he opposed animal sacrifices on Eid in the High Commission premises to respect feelings of Hindus and non-Mus-

Shabab-bin Ahmed, who was posted as Minister in the Embassy of Dhaka at The Hague, was cleared by Bangladesh's Ministry of Foreign Affairs' Administrative Division (Establishment) via an order dated November 21, 2024 to join as Deputy High Commissioner at the Kolkata mission. He was supposed to take over his new assignment in June this year. However, the order was cancelled on Sunday, reportedly after his statement on banning animal sacrifices on Eid inside the High Commission premises, a practice that has been followed for the last four decades. Apparently, Shabab's principled and courageous stand was not liked by the interim government in Bangladesh led by Muhammad Yunus, a host of his advisors and Jamaat-trained student leaders who have radical-Islamic views and remain anti-India in their approach.

Ahmed, who had argued that dip-



lomats "need to respect the customs of the host country", has now been recalled to Dhaka. Analysts, however, praised Shababbin Ahmed for his exemplary diplomatic skills in conveying the message with courage at a juncture when the Yunus regime remains dysfunctional. "Knowing fully well that the fundamentalist hardliner regime in Bangladesh is not going to take kindly to any adherence to progressive and civilised behaviour.

Russia has provided North Korea with Pantsir air defence system, jammers since troop deployment : Report

Seoul, June 1 (IANS): Russia has provided North Korea with its air defence system, electronic warfare jamming devices and other military support since late last year, in blatant violations of UN sanctions amid their deepening ties, an international monitoring report released by Seoul's Foreign Ministry showed on Sunday.

Since November 2024, Moscow has transferred at least one Pantsir mobile air defence system and one Pantsir-class combat vehicle to Pyongyang, the Multilateral Sanctions Monitoring Team (MSMT) said in its first report on the sanctions enforcement. The MSMT was established in October last year with the initiative of South Korea and the United States as an alternative framework to the UN Panel of Experts on North Korean sanctions monitoring. The panel was disbanded in March of the same year due to Russia's veto. Besides South Korea and the US, nine other countries have joined the mechanism -- Australia, Britain, Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, the Netherlands, and New Zealand.

The inaugural report, specifically focusing on the illegal military cooperation between Russia and the North, is the MSMT's first assessment on the sanctions enforcement since its launch.



India to save 7,500 million litre diesel annually, says Union Minister Vaishnaw; MP to get three new trains

Bhopal, June 1 (IANS): The Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said on Sunday that the addition of the third and fourth railway lines between Ratlam-Nagda railway multi-tracking project in Madhya Pradesh will significantly reduce fuel consumption, saving nearly 7.5 crore litre of diesel annually. Moreover, the initiative is expected to prevent the emission of 38 crore kg of carbon dioxide -- an environmental benefit comparable to planting 1.5 crore trees. The Central government has also announced the introduction of three new train services for Madhya Pradesh, enhancing connectivity across key routes. These trains will operate on the Rewa-Pune route via Satna and Jabalpur, Jabalpur-Raipur via Nainpur and Gondia, and Gwalior-Bengaluru via Bhopal and Pune. "All these are tribal belt and will benefit them the most," Union Minister Vaishnaw said through a video conferencing. Asked about the Gwalior-Bengaluru train, Union Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia had recently in a post on his official X account said, "New train will run between Guna-Bengaluru soon... Heartfelt thanks to



@RailMinIndia for approving the operation of a new train from Guna to Bengaluru on my special request. I express my heartfelt gratitude to Union Railway Minister @AshwiniVaishnaw ji for fulfilling the longstanding demand of the passengers of Gwalior-Chambal. The passengers of Guna region, especially my young colleagues working in Bengaluru, will soon be able to avail the benefit of this railway facility." Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav confirmed that the Ratlam-Nagda railway multi-tracking project has received approval, marking a significant boost to the state's railway infrastructure. This initiative is expected to improve transportation efficiency and facilitate smoother travel for passengers. Union Minister Vaishnay, officially announced the project approval of the third and fourth railway lines for the Ratlam-Nagda section under the Pradhan Mantri Gati Shakti Master Plan.

Hectic efforts on to locate missing MP couple, says Meghalaya **CM Sangma**

Shillong, June 1 (IANS): Meghalaya Chief Minister Conrad K. Sangma on Sunday said that the police, district administration and the local community are on a hectic search operation to trace the tourist couple from Madhya Pradesh, who have been reported missing since May 24 while visiting the state's Sohra-Cherrapunji.

In a video message, the Chief Minister said that his Madhya Pradesh counterpart Mohan Yadav spoke to him over the phone, and he also received a call from the office of the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) about the missing newlywed couple from Indore.

"Our police authority, district police led by Superintendent of Police and local administration, along with the entire local community, are conducting a massive search operation round-the-clock basis to find out and rescue the couple. I am personally monitoring the search and rescue efforts constantly," Sangma said.





900 illegal Bangladeshis residing in Delhi will be deported: Delhi Crime Branch

New Delhi, June 1 (IANS): Approximately 900 illegal Bangladeshi nationals residing in Delhi have been identified and will be deported after proper verification, Delhi's Special Commissioner of Police, Crime Branch, Devesh Chandra Srivastava said on Sunday, as the process of deporting undocumented migrants has gained momentum in the wake of the Pahalgam terror attack.

Over the past six months, approximately 700 undocumented migrants in Delhi have been repatriated to Bangladesh under the Indian government's ongoing "pushback" strategy. According to data from the Border Security Force (BSF), Delhi ranks highest among all states in terms of the number of individuals deported across the eastern land border.

The crackdown on undocu-

mented Bangladeshi nationals has intensified across several states, particularly those governed by the BJP. In this period, a significant number of alleged illegal immigrants from Bangladesh have been detained in Delhi, Harvana, Rajasthan, Gujarat, Maharashtra. Uttar Pradesh, and Goa. Following their detention, they have been processed and handed over for deportation. Speaking to IANS, Devesh Chandra Srivastava said, "All our field units, including the Crime Branch and Special Cell, are actively engaged in identifying and taking legal action against Bangladeshi nationals living illegally in Delhi. Those without valid documents have been detained, and legal proceedings are underway. Additionally, action is being taken against individuals who help these migrants obtain fake documents."

He added, "This special campaign began in November and is yielding significant results. It is being conducted across Delhi based on secret intelligence inputs and public complaints."

Mamata Banerjee echoing Pakistan's narrative on Operation Sindoor: BJP

Kolkata, June 1 (IANS): The bands and children were selec-BJP on Sunday lashed out at the West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee for terming the 'name' of Operation Sindoor as "politically motivated", saying that she is echoing Pakistan's narrative on the anti-terror operation launched by the Indian armed forces inside Pakistan.

"In Pahalgam, Hindu women were identified by their shankha and sindoor - symbols of their faith - and their hustively targeted and killed. Two Hindu women from West Bengal were asked to recite the kalma simply because they wore sindoor, and were then forced to witness their husbands being brutally gunned down before their eyes," the BJP's Information Technology Cell chief and the party's central observer for West Bengal, Amit Malviya, wrote on X.

He added that after Operation Sindoor, these same women said they felt truly respected and



honoured. "Yet Mamata Banerjee dismisses the very name of the operation, calling it nothing more than a political stunt. Shame on her. She is echoing the narrative of Pakistan," Malviya said. Earlier, while reacting to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's multiple accusations against the West Bengal government.

15 new COVID-19 cases reported in Rajasthan; Jaipur records highest number

Jaipur, June 1 (IANS): At least 15 new COVID-19 cases were reported in Rajasthan on Sunday, with Jaipur recording the highest number at nine cases.

Jodhpur reported two cases, while four were detected in Udaipur. In addition, a new variant of the coronavirus has been confirmed in the state. Samples from four patients sent to the National Institute of Virology (NIV) in Pune revealed two cases each of the XFG and LF.7.9 variants. Currently, these two variants are being reported more frequently in the western and southern states of India. Apart from them, strains from the JN.1 and NB.1.8.1 series are also being detected. Dr. Deepak Maheshwari, Principal of SMS Medical College, stated that the current strains do not appear to be very serious. "There is no need to panic. However, people should remain cautious. Children, the elderly, and individuals with comorbidities should consider wearing masks in crowded places," he advised. According to the state Health Department, Rajasthan has reported a total of 54 COVID-19 cases so far this year, while one fatality has also been recorded.



WBSSC job case: Protesting teachers to march to state Secretariat tomorrow

Kolkata, June 1 (IANS): The "untainted" or "genuine" teachers of state-run schools in West Bengal, protesting the loss of their jobs following a Supreme Court order last month, announced that they would be organising a "March to State Secretariat" on Sunday. The protesting teachers would start assembling at Sealdah from 11 a.m. on Friday and thereafter start the protest march towards the state Secretariat, Nabanna, located at Mandirtala in Howrah district, adjacent to Kolkata. The unique point of the rally will be that the protester will keep certain portions of their bodies bare during the rally as a symbolic mark of protest. "The evolving situation has stripped the 'untainted' teachers. That's is why we have decided to keep some portions of our bodies bare as a symbolic protest during our rally towards the Secretariat on Friday," said Chinmay Mondal, the convener of the "Jogyo Shikshak-Shikshika Adhikar Mancha" (Genu-

ine Teachers' Rights Forum), the umbrella body under which the "genuine" teachers had been protesting since last month.

The change in FII strategy in India which began in April continues in May. FIIs were continuous sellers in India in the first three months of this year.

Mumbai, June 1 (IANS): The big selling began in January (Rs 78,027 crore) when the dollar index peaked at 111 in mid-January. Thereafter, the intensity of selling declined. FIIs turned buyers in April with a buy figure of Rs 4,243 crore.

"In May up to 30th, FIIs bought equity for Rs 18,082 crore through the exchanges, as per NSDL data. Global macros like declining dollar, slowing US and Chinese economies and domestic macros like high GDP growth and declining inflation and interest rates are

the factors driving FII inflows into India," said Dr VK Vijayakumar, Chief Investment Strategist, Geojit Investments Ltd.

FIIs have been buyers in autos, components, telecom and financials in the first half of May. According to Ketan Vikam, Head of Sales at Almondz Institutional Equities, any further spike in the US bond yields, equity markets could face downward pressure as risk-off sentiment could come into play and drive investors to prune their holdings.



India's forex reserves rise by \$6.99 billion to cross \$692.7 billion

New Delhi, June 1 (IANS): India's foreign exchange reserves recorded a robust increase of \$6.99 billion to \$692.72 billion for the week ended May 23, according to RBI's weekly data released on Sunday. Foreign currency assets, a major component of the reserves, surged by \$4.52 billion to \$586.17 billion, the figures showed. There was also a sharp increase in the value of the gold reserves component of the reserves which went up by \$2.37 billion to \$83.58 billion during the week, according to the RBI data The Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) rose by \$81 million to \$18.571 billion. India's reserve position with the IMF rose \$30 million to \$4.401 billion during the week, the figures showed. In the preceding week ended May 16, the country's forex kitty had declined by \$4.89 billion to \$685.73 billion. However, prior to this, the foreign exchange reserves surged by \$4.5 billion to \$690.62 billion for the



week ended May 9. Any strengthening of the country's foreign exchange kitty also helps bolster the rupee vis-a-vis the US dollar. An increase in the foreign exchange reserves reflects strong fundamentals of the economy and gives the RBI more headroom to stabilise the rupee when it turns volatile.



Vipul Organics reports 46 pc sequential drop in Q4 net profit

Mumbai, June 1 (IANS): Vipul Organics Limited, a specialty chemicals company listed on the BSE, has reported a sharp 45.69 per cent decline in its net profit on a quarter-on-quarter (QoQ) basis for the fourth quarter of FY 2024-25.

The Mumbai-based company posted a net profit of Rs 0.78 crore in Q4, down from Rs 1.44 crore in the previous quarter (Q3), according to its stock exchange filing. However, revenue from operations rose to Rs 44.08 crore in Q4, up from Rs 41.4 crore in Q3, marking a sequential increase of 6.47 per cent. Similarly, total income grew by 5.88 per cent to Rs 43.97 crore compared to Rs 41.53 crore in the previous quarter, as per its filing to BSE. However, rising costs weighed on the bottom line. Total expenses surged by 7.83 per cent to Rs 42.81 crore in Q4.



Indian stock markets witness 2nd consecutive week of consolidation

Mumbai, June 1 (IANS): Indian stock markets ended the week on a cautious note, marking the second consecutive week of consolidation. This subdued performance came amid ongoing global trade tensions and anticipation surrounding domestic policy developments, analysts said on Sunday.

The benchmark indices, Sensex and Nifty, witnessed notable volatility through the week, eventually closing lower as investors reacted to uncertainties over U.S. tariff developments and awaited the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) upcoming monetary policy decision. By the end of the week, the Nifty settled at 24,750.70, while the Sensex closed at 81,451.01.

"Despite encouraging domestic cues, mixed signals from global markets kept investor sentiment on edge. Initially, optimism prevailed following the RBI's record dividend payout and positive updates regarding the monsoon," said Ajit Mishra, SVP, Research, Religare Broking

Sectoral performance remained mixed in line with the overall market consolidation. The realty index extended its winning streak for the

third consecutive week, while banking and energy sectors also ended in the green.

Conversely, FMCG, auto, and metal stocks underperformed and emerged as top laggards. Among the broader markets, both the midcap and smallcap indices managed to register gains of nearly 1.5 per cent each despite the choppy trading environment.

According to Vinod Nair, Head of Research, Geojit Investments Ltd, a fair share of trade tensions with the temporary pause and the subsequent reinstatement of US President Donald Trump's reciprocal trade policies reiterate that the global market may contend with macroeconomic concerns, which may continue to create ripple effects in the emerging markets.

"Left with no other alternative, we have started our agitation in a most democratic manner to draw the attention of the state government and highlight our demands," the spokesman said.

Taking to social media platform X, the Chief Minister outlined a slew of updates spanning financial aid, education, infrastructure, and fuel subsidies.

A major highlight was the upcoming expansion of the flagship Orunodoi 3.0 scheme, which is set to include 37 lakh

Govt committed to protect Manipur's integrity, all efforts underway to establish lasting peace, says CS

Imphal, June 1 (IANS): The Manipur government is committed to maintaining the integrity of the state, and all efforts taken by the state administration are to establish lasting peace in the state, Chief Secretary Prashant Kumar Singh said here on Sunday. The Chief Secretary said that the 5-day Shirui Lily Festival (May 20-24) was organised in the mountainous Ukhrul district as part of the government's normalcy-restoration process. The festival attracted about 1.70 lakh people, he said, adding that people of all communities travelled with families from valley areas and other parts of the state as well as from outside the state to Ukhrul to attend the festival as the state administration provided full-proof security and a safe environment for festive activities. In view of the festival, the Manipur government had taken extensive security measures after reported threats by some individuals and organisations to the Meitei community against entering Kuki tribal-dominated areas during the festival. Shirui Lily Festival,

mostly organised by the Meitei community, is celebrated in honour of the state flower, the Shirui Lily. The Chief Secretary, accompanied by Security Advisor Kuldiep Singh, said that one unfortunate incident occurred on May 20, when a Manipur State Road Transport Bus ferrying journalists to the festival was stopped and the name of the state (Manipur) was reportedly covered, causing widespread criticism. He said that there had been no instructions whatsoever or even a remote thought of covering the name of the state, as has been alleged. "This has been amply clarified by the state government as well as by the responsible political leadership. What transpired on the ground would be revealed after a thorough inquiry only," the Chief Secretary told the media. He said that the state administration has taken the reported untoward incident with utmost seriousness, and the incident is deeply regretted. "In response, the Governor has constituted an inquiry committee comprising the Commissioner, Home and the IT Secretary, which is to submit its report in a time-bound man-



ner," he said. He also assured all concerned that once the report is submitted and those responsible for the lapses, if any, are identified, strict action would be taken.

The state would also ensure that such an incident does not occur in future, the Chief Secretary reiterated and once again requested all to cooperate in maintaining the public order. Two media organisations earlier, in a joint letter to Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla, had said that the security personnel instructed the media team to hide the "Manipur State Transport Corporation" signage in front of the bus carrying 20 journalists and some Information Department officials.

He demanded that all those links connected with Khan should be investigated at the earliest and strict action should be taken against those compromising with the security of the country. Khan was detained on Wednesday night by an Intelligence department team who were acting on security-related inputs. Khan, who works in the district employment office, was

found to have phone numbers associated with Pakistan stored on his device, an official said.

"There were inputs about Shakur Khan that he could be involved in spying for Pakistan. He was on surveillance following inputs and was detained last night," the

official added. A joint questioning was conducted in Jaisalmer following which the Intelligence department team left for Jaipur with Khan. According to sources, the 'spy' Shakur Khan was working as a Personal Assistant to former Minister Mohammad under the previous Congress government in Rajasthan. Khan and Mohammad's villages are nearly eight kilometre away from one another, they said. Mohammad has been a two-time MLA, a Minister, and has fought four elections under the leadership of the previous Ashok Gehlot government.

"The national goal is to bring down the TB incidence rate to 47 cases per lakh population and the mortality rate to below 3 per lakh population." he said.

To achieve these targets, states must "restrategise their TB campaigns, place a sharper focus on vulnerable and high-risk communities", the Minister said, while stressing the importance of expanding access to rapid diagnostic tools, particularly NAAT testing.

Israel cuts growth forecast due to conflict expansion, US tariff policies

The Israeli Ministry of Finance lowered its growth forecast for 2025 to 3.6 per cent, from the 4.3 per cent predicted in January. The ministry on Sunday, explained that the baseline scenario of the previous forecast assumed a reduction in combat and military recruitment in the current year, but this has not materialised so far, Xinhua news agency reported.

The revised scenario anticipates an expanded call-up of reserve forces for combat operations in the second quarter

Jerusalem, June 1 (IANS): of 2025, followed by a gradual reduction in reserve recruitment beginning only in the third quarter. The new forecast also takes into account the impact of the US new import tax policies and recent official data on the activity of the Israeli economy.

The Israeli ministry assumes that the US tariffs rise will lead to a decrease of about two per cent in global trade in 2025 and 2026.

It also revised down the Israeli economy's growth forecast for 2026, from 5.4 to 4.4 per cent. Gad Lior, a senior analyst at the Yedioth Ahronoth newspaper, told Xinhua that the reduction in the growth forecast and the recent larger-than-expected rise in Israel's inflation are expected to lead to a decline in economic activity and a hit to tax revenues.

Gujarat: Fire breaks out near Surat airport runway, flights diverted

Hamas says US ceasefire proposal under review, does not meet Palestinian demands

Gaza, June 1 (IANS): A senior Hamas official said that a US proposal for a ceasefire in the Gaza Strip remains under review, even though it does not meet the core demands of the movement and the Palestinian people.

Basem Naim, a member of Hamas's political bureau, said in a statement, on Thursday, that the movement had received the Israeli response to the US proposal brokered last week by US Special Envoy to the Middle East Steve Witkoff, Xinhua news agency reported. According to Naim, the Israeli position fails to address key Palestinian demands, including a complete cessation of hostilities and the lifting of the longstanding blockade on Gaza. He said the proposal would allow for the continuation of "the occupation" and humanitarian

suffering, even during any temporary truce.

US says Israel accepts temporary Gaza ceasefire proposal

Washington, June 1 (IANS): The White House said that Israel has signed off on a 60-day Gaza ceasefire proposal as Israeli army continues its military actions in the war-torn area.

"I won't comment further, as we are in the midst of this right now," she added. An Israeli official and a US source familiar with the case confirmed that the proposed deal includes not only the 60-day ceasefire.

An early end to the pause, as indicated by US State Department spokesperson Tammy Bruce, would relieve hundreds of thousands of students headed for the US to pursue higher studies later in the year. India is the source country for the largest group of international students in the US and Bruce's comments will be closely followed there.




